Please note that many of the CQ Library titles are under SAGE Knowledge now, with the exception of CQ Researcher and a few other databases, but besides CQ Researcher most of what they have listed for CQ Library would be under the SAGE Knowledge platform now.

For the CQ Researcher choices, if they have the Archive Update option purchased then the "SAGE CQ Press Researcher Annual / Archive" should be the best match, otherwise for any other CQ Researcher Online options the I suggest the regular "SAGE CQ Press Researcher Online" option would be best option to choose.

Please note that they also have the option to download their SAGE Journals KBART holdings or their MARC records for their other SAGE and CQ content directly from their SAGE administrator pages, if they would have the option to use those files to update their collection management systems with Primo, but I would understand if they would prefer to use the built-in collections that Primo will already have for their SAGE content as well.
