I visited the us embassy in bangkok to have an interview for my j1 visa (au pair) and my visa has been refused. The officer did not provide me with a specific reason so i would like to clarify certain points regarding the refusal decisions of my previous visa application.

I have many professional experiences with children, which i explained in detail in ds160. However, during the interview, i did not get a chance to show proof supporting of these experiences.

This opportunity will have a significant impact on my future; I hope you will give me the opportunity to clarify and reconsider my visa application.
