DISCUSSION PROMPTS

- 1. Alexa and Beni are given their second quest: Retrieve a broken promise. At the start of the episode, what did you think this phrase meant? What did this phrase mean in the context of the episode?
- 2. The twins land inside Teatro La Perla in 1897. How does the show's sound designer use audio elements such as effects, volume, and music to make the listener feel like they are in a large performance venue over a century ago?
- 3. In 1907, Lola warns Alexa that she'll have limits placed on her because she's a girl. Alexa says she believes things will be different for her because "things change with time." What are some limitations that Lola faces at the turn of the twentieth century that aren't an issue for Alexa? Are there struggles that Alexa might face now that didn't exist for Lola?

FICTION AND FACTS

Subject: Dolores "Lolita" Tizol Laguardia

On the Show:

1897: After a concert at Teatro La Perla, Young Lola meets Cuban violinist Claudio Brindis de Salas Garrido and promises him she'll dedicate her life to music.

1907: Lola, now a teen, learns she has received a scholarship to study music. Her mother insists music isn't a career for a woman and asks Lola's father to convince her to study education instead.

In Real Life:

Dolores "Lolita" Tizol Laguardia was born in Ponce in 1890. At a young age, Lolita excelled at playing the violin and she studied with several great musicians, including Claudio Brindis de Salas Garrido when he visited Puerto Rico. Lolita was offered a scholarship to study music in Boston, but she followed her father's advice to pursue a degree in education instead. Lolita went on to teach at several schools, eventually becoming the principal of Escuela Rafael Pujals in Ponce where she started a meal program for children who lacked food security. Lolita was a member of the Ponce Symphony Orchestra. There's a statue dedicated to Lolita Tizol's memory located in Tricentennial Park in Ponce.

Subject: Claudio Brindis de Salas Garrido

On the Show: Claudio Brindis de Salas gives a concert at Teatro La Perla and then agrees to take on a Young Lola as a pupil.

In Real Life: Claudio Brindis de Salas Garrido was a world-renowned Afro-Cuban violinist who toured the world playing his Stradivarius, a rare instrument famous for its unique sound. Brindis de Salas taught Lolita Tizol while visiting Puerto Rico on a tour.
