Online Learning Plan

Central Fulton School District

I. Overview

The Central Fulton School District is committed to providing high-quality education in a safe and adaptable environment. Our Online Learning Plan combines in-person and remote instruction to meet the diverse needs of our students and ensure continuity of learning in any situation, including during inclement weather or public health emergencies.

II. Instructional Models

1. Online Learning Schedule (Grades K-12)

Students will follow an online schedule that includes remote learning.

2. Full-Time Remote Option

On Flexible Instructional Days remote learning will occur. Certified district teachers will provide instruction aligned with the district's curriculum via a virtual platform: Canvas or Google Classroom.

3. Special Education & Support Services

Students with IEPs, 504 Plans, and English Learners may attend additional tutoring sessions or receive targeted remote support based on individual needs.

III. Flexible Instruction Days (FID)

Definition:

Flexible Instruction Days are pre-approved instructional days that count as official school days and can be used during emergencies such as inclement weather.

FID Plan Use:

- The district may use up to 5 FID days per school year.
- FID will be implemented in the event of weather-related closures or other emergencies that prevent safe in-person attendance.
- Students will participate in instruction from home using district-provided devices and online platforms.
- Teachers will post assignments and conduct live sessions or provide instructional materials aligned with the regular curriculum.

FID Communication:

- Families and staff will be notified via Skyward Alert System, the district website, and social media by 6:30 a.m. on the day a FID is called.
- Instructions for FID participation will be provided at the start of the school year and reviewed regularly. Teachers will communicate expectations to parents through Class Dojo, Skyward Alert System, and/or email.

IV. Technology & Access

- Devices: All students in grades K-12 will be issued a district-owned device (Chromebook or iPad). The primary grades will have paper packets to work on from home as their devices do not travel home.
- **Internet Access:** The district will support families with internet connectivity needs through hotspot distribution or local partnerships.

• Learning Platforms:

- Grades K–5: Google Classroom, Google Meet, and/or Canvas
- Grades 6–12: Google Classroom, Google Meet, and/or Canvas

V. Attendance & Accountability

- In-Person Days: Traditional attendance procedures apply.
- Remote/FID Days: Students must log into their learning platforms and complete daily assignments to be marked present.
- Teachers will monitor participation, assess learning progress, and provide feedback on all assignments.

VI. Professional Development & Family Support

- Teachers receive ongoing professional development on hybrid instruction, digital tools, and student engagement.
- Families will be offered training on navigating digital platforms and supporting student learning at home when requested.

VII. Evaluation & Adjustments

- The district will collect feedback from students, staff, and families through regular surveys.
- Adjustments will be made to this model as necessary to support instructional effectiveness and equity.
