Behavior Magnitude Scale		
1	Behavior is confined only to the observed individual. May include such behavior as refusing to follow directions, scowling, crossing arms, pouting, or muttering under breath.	
2	Behavior disrupts others in the individual's immediate area. May include slamming materials down, throwing things away, name calling, cursing.	
3	Behavior disrupts everyone in the environment. May include throwing objects, yelling out, open and loud defiance of directions, or leaving the environment.	
4	Behavior disrupts other environments or common areas. May include throwing objects, yelling out, open and loud defiance of all directions, or leaving the environment.	
5	Behavior causes or threatens to cause physical injury to an individual or others. May include display(ing) of dangerous weapons (yielding items as a weapon) or assaulting others.
