Overview:

It's hard to imagine a more difficult time to be a freshman. Network data reflect the weight of the challenges this fall, and subgroup gaps reveal troubling trends. We must support our Grade 9 students -- and educator teams -- by working together to pursue creative ideas. Together, we will explore current Grade 9 data and consider implications for our work going forward.
