Conclusion: Conclude with a brief synthesis of the results, highlighting their practical implications and contribution to the field. This section should emphasize the significance of the work to encourage further exploration.

Length: The abstract should be approximately 200 words.

Keywords: 3 to 5 keywords, arranged alphabetically.

The author is also expected to outline findings from previous studies to strengthen the foundation of the research. In accordance with the guidelines, the closing sentence of this section must state the primary objective of the study. Finally, all information must be presented in text format without the inclusion of any tables or figures.

Method

Write your research method in a narrative form or as a smooth-flowing paragraph, rather than a list of instructions. Briefly explain the research design, the sampling process, and the core work procedures. Focus on the key parameters observed and how the data was analyzed. You do not need to include overly detailed technical manuals or minor instructions; simply describe the essential points of how the data was collected.

Result and Discussion

The Results and Discussion section should highlight the primary findings of the study. Authors are encouraged to emphasize significant results rather than merely re-stating the data already presented in tables. The focus should be on interpreting the trends and discussing their implications in a narrative and analytical manner.

Sub-Chapter of Result and Discussion

The author is expected to interpret the results and then connect them with other journals (accompanied by scientific discussions and arguments that support). The discussion should be able to align with the main purpose of research in the Introduction. Writers may include tables or graphics on the results and discussions.

Table Format

Table captions are placed above the table and numbered sequentially, typed with single spacing, and should not be bolded. The title must clearly explain 'what, where, and when' the data was collected. Tables should follow an open format, using only horizontal lines, with a maximum limit of 5 tables per paper. Ensure that tables are not split across pages and stay within the page margins. If a table is cited from another source, the source must be written below the table using a 7pt font size. For very wide tables, place them at either the very top or bottom of the page to fit the layout correctly.

Format Images and Graphics

Captions or titles for images and graphs are placed below the image and centered. Each image must be numbered sequentially according to its appearance in the text (e.g., "Figure 1"), using 1 spacing and **without bold** formatting. Images should follow an open format, displaying only horizontal lines. The maximum limit is 5 figures, and they must not exceed the page margins. If an image is cited from another source, the source must be clearly written directly below the image.

Furthermore, authors are required to include logical and applicable recommendations derived directly from the analysis and research procedures.

Additional:

- 1.The manuscript is written by using Microsoft Word computer program with Times New Roman font size 12 with A4 page size and with moderate size margins.
- 2.The contents of the article use a two-column format except the title, correspondence and abstract.
- 3.Margin or limit of writing from the edge of the paper is left margin of 4 cm, right margin of 3 cm, top margin of 3 cm, and bottom margin of 3 cm.
- 4.The first letter of reference title is written with capital letters, the rest with small letters, except the names of people, places, and time.
- 5.All plagiarism rates of scientific articles are checked through TURNITIN software 2 times; the first journal entry and the review version.
