- IMPORTANT REMINDERS!!! <u>Families</u> with positive COVID-19 household members need to <u>quarantine for 10 days</u> from the last date of exposure. If a student or household member is awaiting test results, students should not attend school until all results have been received and are negative. Negative rapid tests can be followed by a positive lab test.
- If your child is absent from school due to COVID-19 quarantine, please know that these absences are excused.

 We would like to notify you that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices has now authorized the emergency use of a COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 5 to 11.

The decision to receive a vaccine or have your child receive a vaccine is one for you and your medical provider to determine. No vaccines will be administered to minor children without the advance approval of you as a parent or caregiver.

The State of New Hampshire has preordered an initial 15,000 doses of the vaccine for this age population, which will be distributed to more than 200 health care providers. In addition, there are currently about 70 pharmacy sites throughout the state that will be offering this vaccine to children ages 5 to 11. These sites include select CVS, Walgreens, Rite Aid, Osco, Hannaford, Walmart and Sams Club locations.

- USDA Waiver for Food Services: The USDA has extended the waiver that allows ALL Students to receive free meals through the 2021-2022 school year. This waiver, set to expire on June 30, 2022, allows all students to have a no charge breakfast and lunch at school each day as long as they choose a fruit or vegetable with their meals. These meals are provided free of charge as part of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act of 2020, USDA Food & Nutrition Service waiver.
