

Chats shown in previously-unreleased 'feeder' report list a new string of allegations against right-wing former - and some current - party staff



The revelations of a leaked Labour Party internal report into the behaviour of right-wing former - and a few current - employees at the party's headquarters have infuriated Labour and union members.

The report alleges that staff - including the general secretary and other senior party employees - undermined Labour's 2017 election campaigns and/or obstructed disciplinary processes, or made abusive remarks about other staff and elected officials, including the idea of setting fire to

then-leader Jeremy Corbyn and his team, as well as a man they believed had mental health issues.

But it has largely been ignored by the media.

Now the SKWAWKBOX has obtained an additional document that reveals even more of the WhatsApp chats summarised in the leaked report - and that makes further damning allegations, including antisemitic comments and attempts to lose elections in order to remove then-leader Jeremy Corbyn.

The document is a feeder report, of which some parts were included in the full leaked report, but not all. Key additional sections not already released are shown below.

Voting for rival parties

Patrick Heneghan, at the time Labour's *campaign lead*, discussed voting options with Anna Hutchinson - who is still the party's regional director for the north-west.

Hutchinson asked 'What happens if you vote Lib Dem?' and Heneghan advises that anything but a vote for the Conservatives will put Corbyn into Downing Street:

Staff discussed a "coalition of chaos" with Corbyn if they voted "for anyone but Tories":

Do we have to win Copeland, then?

The feeder report showed a conversation between then party director Emilie Oldknow - a hot tip

before the leak scandal as Keir Starmer's pick as a new Labour general secretary - and a

regional director working on the 2017 Copeland by-election, stating that it suggested a desire

not to win it.

As a conversation about the candidate's anti-Corbyn comments leads to the realisation that this

would make it harder to use a loss against Jeremy Corbyn, regional director Fiona Stanton says

"So I need to win then... ahhh!"

Oldknow's response: "I wouldn't go that far..."

When the Regional Director Fiona Stanton said the fact that the candidate opposes Corbyn and therefore that her defeat could be blamed on her not being a Corbyn supporter, Stanton said that means she now needs to win the by-election for Labour, suggesting that had not been her intention previously. Oldknow replied saying "I wouldn't go that far", suggesting Oldknow did not want Labour to win the Copeland by-election and was indicating to the Regional Director that she should not try to win. Patrick Heneghan then said that Labour has to try to win and Oldknow corrected herself:

These conversations weren't the only example the report provides. McNicol asks his campaign director whether he can respond to an email during the general election campaign by saying that Labour is "more likely to lose 80 seats than gain 80".

The conversation also refers to Heneghan only allocating 15 mailers per seat to most seats, while funnelling the rest to the 'Ergon House' side-project to protect right-wing MPs. That project *is* mentioned in the main leaked report.

And McNicol shows that he found the 'purge' of members during the 2016 leadership election a humorous matter, quipping "I think we suspended about a third of the audience" at an Albert Hall event.

the Labour right, rather than to use these funds in seats that Labour needed to gain to be able to form a government. Tom Watson, Yvette Cooper, Angela Eagle, Heidi Alexander, Chuka Umunna and Rachel Reeves all benefited from the secret 'Ergon House' project, even though they were all in safe seats. This was deliberately hidden from LOTO. Here, senior staff discuss the fact that they are only sending "15 mailers per seat" for most seats and that the rest of the campaign funding is "going to ergon house":

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A tough few months

Conversations showing that HQ staff were appalled at Labour's seat gains in 2017 appear in the report that has already been leaked. But more appear in the feeder report, with McNicol warning everyone on the day after the vote that they are in for "a tough few months".

Another senior staffer, who will be named this evening when the window for comment expires, lamenting that when she had woken back up she hadn't found it to be a crazy dream that "We won seats and Corbyn stays?".

lain McNicol said:

Tracey Allen said she was "hiding under the duvet" following the election results:

'Rats' and noses

The report points out a conversations in which conversations took place about a Jewish party activist, which it linked to antisemitism - and highlights another conversation about the nose of Labour's Jewish former leader:

Staff discussed a "Lansman rat" when LOTO's Political Secretary asked to attend the next Conference Arrangement Committee meeting and agree to tell her that "only staff who have to give reports and service the CAC can attend if she asks again". Jon Lansman is one of the most senior Jewish individuals in the party. Depicting Jewish people as rats and vermin has often been a feature in antisemitic propaganda and discourse.

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27/03/2017, 19:19 - Patrick Heneghan: I'm told Lansman is in Corb's office right now for "crisis talks". Are you hearing anything?
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27/03/2017, 19:21 - Julie Lawrence: Katy rang me earlier asking to come to next CAC and processes. Thought I could smell a rat. A Lansman rat.

27/03/2017, 19:32 - Emilie Oldknow: She's asked for all the deadline stuff for conference today

27/03/2017, 19:32 - Emilie Oldknow: And she cannot go to the CAC. It is wholly inappropriate

27/03/2017, 19:35 - Julie Lawrence: I just forwarded her to Anna as CAC sec and didn't agree or tell her anything.

27/03/2017, 19:35 - Emilie Oldknow: It's ok. John has sent it to her

27/03/2017, 19:37 - Julie Lawrence: Only staff who have to give reports and service the CAC attend if she asks again?

27/03/2017, 19:39 - Emilie Oldknow: Yes. Brill x

John Stolliday, then Director of the Governance and Legal Unit called Ed Miliband "beaker" and "runt of the litter" and, Mike Creighton, then Director of Audit and Risk, admitted to having an anonymous twitter account and suggesting he may have used this to criticise Miliband when he was leader.

The Stolliday conversation also shows him claiming to operate an anonymous Twitter account,

while Mike Creighton - one of those who appeared in the infamous Panorama programme

alleging Labour antisemitism - believed Stolliday had 'multiple' anonymous accounts and joked

that Stolliday had been the one tweeting about Ed Miliband's nose. Stolliday denied having multiple accounts.

Briefing hostiles

The report includes a WhatsApp chat from polling day in the 2017 general election that shows senior staff briefing 'lines' to centrist figures who appeared frequently on television opposing and criticising Labour and its policies under Jeremy Corbyn:

On polling day, rather than getting out the vote as most Labour staff do on polling day, the General Secretary and senior staff were briefing Ayesha Hazarika, Ed Balls and Alastair Campbell about what lines to give on the media that evening:

08/06/2017, 18:12 - Julie Lawrence: Are we briefing other labour voices, eg Alastair Campbell, Ayesha who are doing media?
08/06/2017, 18:16 - Tracey Allen: Ed B yes via Patrick. Alastair - Iain has been spking to direct. Don't know about anyone else
08/06/2017, 20:13 - Patrick Heneghan: Spoke to Ed and Alastair. All sorted 08/06/2017, 20:13 - Tracey Allen: Our guru to the stars³⁷

If these chats are discovered, we'll say we were hacked

A comment by a former regional director shows, according to the report, that staff were aware that they were behaving inappropriately:

Staff seemed to be aware that the whatsapp messages they were sending were not appropriate, saying being hacked would be their "excuse" when the time comes.

09/11/2016, 19:40 - John Stoliday: Has lain been hacked? 09/11/2016, 19:40 - Fiona Stanton: That will be all of our excuses when the time comes⁸

'JunkiesforJez'

A key point in the 2017 general election campaign was the spontaneous chant of 'Oh Jeremy

Corbyn' by the crowd at a stadium music event in the north-west, which brought into focus the groundswell of public support for the Labour leader.

But the report says that the show of support made one staffer 'feel ill', while another thought the music fans must all be on drugs:



Jeremy Corbyn has just addressed 20,000 people at Prenton Park.

Never seen anything like this. #ForTheMany

Senior staff opposed Corbyn and McDonnell's policies of "catching tax dodgers" and "taxing the rich":

Emilie Oldknow described Debbie Abrahams as "very stupid":

Love Blair, hate Corbyn

Leaked WhatsApp chats included in the report show that HQ staff had conversations about knives in Corbyn's back and naming a conference room after former Labour PM Tony Blair, whom many members feel should be tried for war crimes.

They also reacted with despair to members asking for Blair - who regularly appeared on TV or in print discouraging voters from supporting Labour - but believed that Corbyn should have been expelled 'years ago':

Tracey Allen said that "when the knives are being pulled out of JC's back" they should rename the main Southside meeting room "the Blair room", and that they would have a grand opening and invite Blair, "shirts optional". They said the "jez room" would be the "cupboard".

Senior staff's refusal to supend Simon Danczuk, who was accused of sexual harassment, and Keith Vaz, who was under police investigation, contrasted with their attitude to Corbyn, saying they wish they had expelled Corbyn years ago:

Let's get Corbyn blamed for Danczuk

Simon Danczuk was suspended and ultimately deselected as Labour MP for Rochdale after being caughting 'sexting' a 17-year-old girl. According to chats in the feeder report, HQ staff discussed making sure Corbyn's office 'get the blame' - and the need to 'knock out' a local Momentum candidate.

Emilie Oldknow said that she was "trying to delay selection" to allow as much time as possible for "issues" to develop - and says they will need to act "by stealth":

The NEC disagreed with Emilie Oldknow, however, and voted to not endorse Danczuk. Senior staff discussed their concern that his removal could mean that a left-wing candidate was selected in his place, such as LOTO Political Secretary Katy Clark, who they appear to call "the wicked witch of the west". Tracey Allen said they had to make sure LOTO got the blame for Danczuk and for the selection. Oldknow said she was trying to delay the selection to allow the longest possible time and that she would try to stitch up the panel, but that Karie Murphy would "see straight through that".

of Labour's campaign director when he said Corbyn 'can fuck off'.

McNicol, who was criticised in 2017 for the number of holidays he took during election

campaigns, also proposed that he should have another one:

'Bored' during a general election campaign

The new report alleges that staff's expressions of boredom during the 2017 general election

campaign showed 'that they were not working hard for a Labour victory':

A month into the general election campaign, staff in Iain McNicol's office said they were "bored", suggesting they were not working hard for a Labour victory:

'Get rid of that useless lunatic' colleague

Staff discussed with contempt an employee of Labour MP Andrew Gwynne and his attempts to persuade MPs to submit relevant questions - and used a mental health smear in deciding that 'someone needs to tell him to ditch that useless lunatic':

The PLP Secretary and Director of PLP Services said Andrew Gwynne needed to ditch his political adviser, who she called a "useless lunatic:

Proscribing Momentum and 'we didn't purge enough' Labour members

The report says that HQ staff had a lengthy chat pining for left-wing group Momentum to be 'proscribed' - and offering the opinion that the 2016 purge of left-wing Labour members 'didn't go far enough'.

Emilie Oldknow, meanwhile, is shown saying she wants to avoid something that will mean "Then I will have to do some work":

Proscribing Momentum and purging the left:

The Director of the Governance and Legal Unit and the Director of Audit and Risk and other staff discussed proscribing Momentum, so that membership of Momentum would be "incompatible with membership of the party". Tracey Allen said the "ipurge' didn't go far enough for me". John Stolliday said he was replying to Emilie Oldknow's email in a "formal way" on the Party's email system but that it was going into his "file" on Momentum, and Oldknow thanks him, and Stolliday says Momentum "can all fuck off". Oldknow separately asked him to "keep all this stuff" on Momentum, saying they need someone in the Governance and Legal Unit to "keep a big log of it all", Stolliday says he already has a file, to which Oldknow says "mwah ha ha ha".

This suggests that if Oldknow were to become General Secretary, she could proscribe Momentum and expel every Momentum member from the party.

Oldknow also suggests she did not do much work in her role as Director of Governance, Membership and Party Services, saying "No chance. Then I would have to do some work".

The report highlights a discussion about enlisting right-wing unions to block a move by

members to speed up the implementation of motions and rule changes approved by the party's sovereign annual conference:

The SKWAWKBOX contacted Iain McNicol, Emilie Oldknow, Patrick Heneghan, John Stolliday,

regional director for north-west England, declined and no answer was received from the others.

The SKWAWKBOX attempted, but was unable, to locate contact details for others mentioned.

One person's name has been redacted pending the expiry of a deadline to comment.

SKWAWKBOX view:

The UK's media might be largely ignoring the scandal - described by some as the biggest in

Labour's history - but members of the party and of affiliated unions are in uproar.

Keir Starmer's investigation - which <u>centres primarily around the 'circumstances' of the report's</u>

<u>creation and leaking</u> - is not even close to adequate.

Without prejudice as to their guilt, those mentioned in the report must be suspended from any office or membership they still hold - and barred from taking up any new positions - until a full independent investigation is completed and any appropriate action can be taken.

The Unison union, in accordance with the <u>wishes</u> of its lay and NEC members, must do the same.

Those who worked hard for a Labour victory deserve that at the least - but neither Starmer nor Unison boss <u>Dave Prentis</u> have yet shown the inclination.
