4. Guest Speakers
 1. Dr. Brian Tieu (GSK) on RSV vaccine (25 mins)
 1. RSV Disease State Presentation
 2. RSV-a vs RSV-b
 1. Type A: more severe
 3. 2 surface glycoproteins facilitate infection; surface fusion protein conserved btwn type A and type B
 4. Nationally Oct-May with peak in Feb (similar to influenza)
 5. Most common cause of acute lower respiratory in kids, adults continue to be infected, geriatrics at greatest risk for severe infections due to weakened immunity
 6. Virus can survive on surfaces for many hours
 7. Infected people contagious for 3-8 days
 8. Sx mirror other respiratory illnesses
 9. Studies show older adults who are hospitalized are more likely to have more severe infections and functional decline can prolong to more than 2 months after hospitalization
 10. Need appropriate T-cell response to kill and rid body of virus; more severe cases occur when T-cell counts are low
 11. Comorbidities also increase severity of infection
 12. 4-8% fatal in hospital
 13. Economic burden exceeds \$1 billion
 14. Best way to test: PCR analysis, but under diagnosed
 15. No treatment options
 16. Prevention is key!
 17. Questions: not aware of any mutations yet, but 2 types that genetically differ at protein G
 18. There is a prophylactic monoclonal antibody therapy for kids. Vaccines are being worked on.
 19. Correlation to COPD, but no data on correlation to smoking

 1. Medical Devices and Equip: spacers should be able to be sold without a prescription; also glucose testing equipment - not just to permit sales in pharmacies without prescription, but to allow pharmacists to furnish prescription to bill under insurance.
 2. Health screenings by pharmacists to encourage referrals and decrease time to treatment, focus on mental health screening
 3. Compensation: compensation should align with education
