Seed Companies

These companies all sell non-GMO seeds, grown responsibly. I have grown seeds from almost all companies listed, and have friends who rave about the ones I haven't personally tried yet.

<u>Project Grow Seeds</u> Heirloom tomato and pepper seeds from plants grown by volunteers in Ann Arbor, Michigan, without chemical fertilizers, pesticides or herbicides using organic practices. Project Grow is a community garden non-profit.

<u>Garden Hoard</u> Founded in 2010 in Livonia, Michigan. Open-pollinated, hand-collected seeds. Nice seed packet designs with detailed sowing instructions. Also offers free seeds for a SASE.

<u>Ann Arbor Seed Co</u> Founded in 2012. Open-pollinated vegetable and ornamental seeds grown in Washtenaw County, Michigan.

<u>Renee's Garden</u> Flower, vegetable and herb seeds chosen for great flavor, easy growing and great performance. Beautiful drawings on seed packets, excellent instructions. Some seeds USDA-certified as organic. Safe seed pledge. In Felton, California.

<u>D. Landreth Seed Company</u> America's oldest seed company, founded in 1784. Flower, vegetable, herb, grass, and wildflower seeds. In New Freedom, Pennsylvania.

<u>Victory Seeds</u> Rare, open-pollinated, non-GMO, non-hybrid and heirloom vegetable, grain, flower, herb and tobacco seeds. In Molalla, Oregon.

<u>Thomas Jefferson's Monticello</u> Heirloom and historic flower, vegetable and herb seeds. Interesting and unusual varieties. In Charlottesville, Virginia.

<u>BBB Seeds</u> Wildflower, heirloom and organic heirloom vegetable, and native grass seeds. Also wildflower seed mixes. In Boulder, Colorado.

<u>Prairie Moon Nursery</u> Native seeds and plants for prairie, meadow, wetland, savanna, and woodland. Also has a wonderful collection of photos of the seeds themselves. In Winona, Minnesota.

<u>Botanical Interests</u> Flower, herb, and vegetable seeds, including over 150 varieties of USDA-certified organic seed. Safe seed pledge. In Broomfield, Colorado.

<u>Territorial Seed Company</u> Seeds of veggies, flowers, herbs, fruits, and vines. Safe seed pledge. In Cottage Grove, Oregon.

<u>Johnny's Selected Seeds</u> Vegetable, medicinal and culinary herb, flower, cover crop, farm, pasture mix, and fruit seeds. In Waterville, Maine.

<u>High Mowing Organic Seeds</u> Over 600 heirloom, open-pollinated and hybrid varieties of vegetable, fruit, herbs and flower seeds. In Wolcott, Vermont.
