

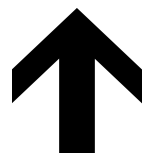

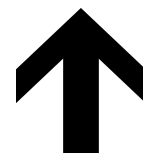

Opening Question: What one word, phrase, or quote is the most important to this text and why?	<i>"Trust me...a true writer never has just one notebook." (page 28)</i>	<i>In the book, Isaiah recently lost his father and his teacher suggests that he should keep writing as a way to express himself. This is an important quote because writing is a good way to share our own stories and learn from each other. As I did my "Stranger" What We Keep writing, I learned that writing stories can unlock new understandings about people that I never knew before.</i>	<i>These ideas connect together because if we want to show empathy towards others, then we need to be willing to write our own stories so they can be shared with others. Also, we should listen to people's stories in order to avoid things like stereotypes and judgment.</i>



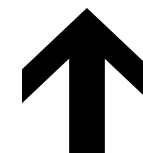
