Course Description:

This course introduces students to the various genres that have made up popular music throughout history. An in-depth look is taken at the history of music, analyzing its trends, and the political and social events that influenced it. Upon completion of the course, students will also have a greater appreciation of music through an increased understanding and awareness of its component parts. Students will study a variety of stylistic periods of music, and the works of representative composers and artists. No performance skills are required for this class, emphasis is placed on listening and analysis.

Routine:

- Arrive on time.
- Be prepared. You must have all of your materials with you at the start of class.
