Art and Social Issues¹

EQ: How do artists respond to social issues?

Artists sometimes respond to social issues by creating a work of art. Your objective is to create a work of art that responds to the situation at hand regarding COVID-19. You may use any material to draw, paint, sculpt, or create your work of art.

(For example, if you don't have paper you can use the inside of a cereal box and then draw on it with pencil. If you don't have a pencil, you can be creative and use coffee at different strengths to create a range of value/tones, or ketchup, or oil to stain. If you are familiar with digital drawing tools you can create a work of art through digital media. Photography would be an ideal medium for this project. Use your phone to create a photo essay.)

Questions to Answer in Your Sketchbook (or any other paper):

- 1. What are your current feelings towards the effect that COVID-19 is having on society & our culture?
- 2. What would you like your art to do about it?
 - a. Record the facts? (infographic/illustration)
 - b. Advocate for safety? (infographic/visual directions)
 - c. Give yourself an outlet to work through the changes? (visual journaling)
 - d. Get out your anger/anxiety towards it? (expressive)
 - e. Comment on society? (social artwork illustration, cartoon, or statement piece)
- 3. What kind of imagery would serve the purpose of your piece so that you are communicating your intent and meaning clearly?
- 4. What kind of materials would serve the purpose of your piece?
