COURSE SELECTION APPOINTMENTS

- Student appointments are posted on the bulletin boards near the restrooms/Cove on the first floor. Take a photo, set a reminder in your phone, or write it in your planner.
- IF YOU MISSED YOUR APPOINTMENT check your email for a new date or see your counselor for a new date. Students who miss two appointments will have their courses chosen for them.
- All students have a course selection appointment even if you have had an IEP meeting.

After your appointment, please bring home the course review sheet & have it signed by your parent/guardian. Bring it back & drop it in the basket in the guidance office. If classes are overenrolled, the first students we remove are those who did not return a signed sheet.

Some points to clear up about course selection

- 1. All course selections for all students are processed on the same day. Everyone has an equal chance to get their choices.
- 2. There is no "seniority" with course options all students have an equal chance to get their choices.
- 3. Having alternate options gives you more opportunity to get something you requested.



GIRL'S CAREER INSTITUTE - WEST MILFORD WOMEN'S CLUB

The West Milford Women's Club sponsors a delegate to the annual Girl's Career Institute (GCI), a four-day mini-college and career exploration experience. The program affords a unique experience for approximately 180 girls finishing their Junior year in a New Jersey High School. Our local West Milford Women's Club will sponsor a delegate and pay the full \$350 tuition.

This program will be of interest to students who are considering attending college but may need some encouragement or incentive. Girl's Career Institute (GCI) provides the delegates with a teste of college life. They will live in a dorm, with a roommate on the Douglass Residential College Campus at Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey. They will eat in the university's cafeteria, meet delegates from other New Jersey towns and take on the responsibility of scheduling their own free time. Most importantly, GCI offers the delegates an opportunity to learn the many career options available to young women today. Since 1955 the NJSFWC has also offered a scholarship to an incoming Douglass Residential College first-year student who attended GCI. The focus of this workshop is to give students information about the college admissions process which includes filling out the college application, financial aid, preparing yourself in high school for college, and much, much more.

NJSCA High School Award Criteria

The candidate must be a New Jersey resident, a current year graduate of a New Jersey high school and have been accepted/plan to enroll in a post secondary institution. Must show proof of acceptance if selected for the award.

The candidate must write a 300-500 word essay describing how a school counselor has influenced his/her life in a positive way. You can give specific examples about your counselor such as helping you make an important decision, providing support in a critical time, assisting in developing self-understand and self-acceptance, etc.

Senior interested in pursuing a career in the emergency management field of study. - <u>Transcript request form</u>. This is required to enable your school counselor to send your transcript and letters of recommendation to the requested colleges. You must submit one for EACH school to which you apply. This form is to be completed by the student.

Types of ABUSE

Abuse comes in many forms.



Emotional/Verbal abuse

Non-physical behaviors such as threats, insults, screaming, constant monitoring, or isolation.



Financial abuse

Exerting power and control over a partner through their finances, such as taking or withholding money from a partner, or prohibiting a partner from earning



Stalking

Being repeatedly watched, followed, monitored or harassed. Occurs online or in person, & can include giving unwanted gifts.



Physical abuse

Any intentional use of physical touch to cause fear, injury, or assert control, such as hitting, shoving, & strangling.



Sexual abuse

Any sexual activity that occurs without willing, active, unimpaired consent, such as unwanted sexual touch, sexual assault (rape), & tampering with contraceptives



Digital abuse

Using technology to bully, stalk, threaten or intimidate a partner using texting, social media, apps, tracking, etc..
