As per the Section VI Constitution item 7.6, "The representative members on each sport committee will be appointed by each league and have only one vote per league. Other non-voting members may be selected by the Sport Chairperson. Federated sport representative members that are appointed by their division, league or school will have only one vote. The Sport Chairs of Federated Sports that have divisions will verify that among division representatives each participating league is represented. The Sport Chair may only vote when the vote is tied. A Sport Chair who also represents a league can serve in both capacities but will have only one vote."

A joint proposal for boys and girls tennis was approved which states that all NYSPHSAA tennis players are **required** to claim their profile in the Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) system prior to the season. This provides NYSPHSAA and member sections a comprehensive system to properly seed its tournaments.

All tennis schools are REQUIRED to do the following prior to the season:

Step 1 – [Click this link to activate your team page](#). All **NYSPHSAA** teams are available to be claimed on Universal Tennis for FREE.

Step 2 – Once your school is activated, please enter your **current** rosters into UTR. Enter all freshman, junior varsity, and varsity players.

- If a player is not registered on Universal Tennis, they need to create their free player profile. A QR code will be provided that makes it simple and easy to get your players registered on UTR. Have them scan the QR code at the beginning of practice to create their free UTR profile, or just have them go to <https://app.universaltennis.com/join> to register. Players can also be invited to the team roster via email.

Step 3 - Enter Scores (You must be signed in to your account and on your high school page)

Post Dual Match Scores

- Choose "Create Event"
- Choose "Official" when asked Is this an official High School event or a fundraiser/other event?
- Choose "Dual Match"
- Start typing in opponent school and select
- Choose "yes or no" if the dual match should be grouped in your standings?
- Enter date, time, location
- Choose the individual match lineups by selecting each player from the team roster - note that only players who are on the team roster will appear in the drop-down
- Post scores for the individual dual matches, as well as the overall team score

- 1) The format for Section VI Individual and Team Tournaments are subject to change.
- 2) Additional information including changes may be found in Sectional Pre-season and Post-season reports published by the Section VI Athletic Council and the Tennis Chairperson, and is available through those offices and/or your athletic director.

Team Sectional Championship

We will run a 2 DAY TOURNAMENT (see page 3 for dates) The top 8 schools in each Division 1 and Division 2 will participate unless opted out. The overall winners of both divisions will play in the Regional Championship on Oct. 23rd at a location in Section VI for a chance to qualify for the State Team Championship that will be held on 11/6.

If you need the list of the old tie breakers - here they are determine which you use & list them in your book **OLD Tie breaker list was in 212.4**

If teams have identical power ratings, the following criteria will be used to determine break the tie:

- a. The team with the most **League/Division** wins will be the higher seeded team. If still tied:
- b. The team with the fewest league **League/Division** losses will be the higher seeded team. If still tied:
- c. The team with the higher winning percentage of games scheduled will be the higher seeded team (determined by total league wins divided by total **League/Division** games scheduled). If still tied:
- d. If teams are in the same **League/Division**, use head-to-head results. If still tied:
- e. A toss of a coin will determine the higher seeded team.

Duties of League Chairperson

1. Organize and administer all meetings necessary for the proper and efficient conduct of league competition.
2. Be responsible for rules and rule changes governing play within the league **and including league tournaments.**
3. Assist the Section Chairperson in the execution of duties of the office upon request.
4. Determine the best singles players in accordance with the number of representatives allowed for that league and ranked by ability through league records and/or league tournament.
5. Determine the best doubles teams in accordance with the number of representatives allowed for that league and ranked by ability through a league doubles tournament.
6. Determine the best teams in accordance with the number of representatives allowed for that league and ranked by ability through league records and/or league tournament.
7. Ensure that entry forms are submitted on time and attend, or have a representative attend, the seeding meeting and other meetings called by the Tennis Chairperson.

Post Season Recommendations

Please address to the Committee and the Chairperson, any recommendations for revisions of the Rules, Format, Handbook, Coaches Directory, etc.

League Qualifying Process

1. Each league will determine how to qualify singles and double teams for the **Individual** Sectional Tournament.
2. **Guidelines** - suggested for qualifying Tournament:
 - a. League will determine the site for the Tournament.
 - b. Players from the same team should be put into opposite sides of the draw.
 - c. Depending on the number of players needed, set up a procedure to determine who will represent their league. For example, if two players are needed, then the two finalists will represent their league. If a third player is needed, have a play-off for the two losers of the semi-finals for their spot. The league chairperson will determine how this will be done prior to the tournament.

Section VI Tournament Rules

1. Any player wishing to play Section VI competition must have played at least 6 scheduled contests during the season with a coach present.
2. All **League Chairpersons** should call the Section VI Sport chair on page 3, to **enter all your representatives** in the Section VI Tournament by the entry due date.
3. Coaches wishing to have players **considered for seeding** must send a record of all important matches. This year's record, previous Sectional Tournament results, head-to-head results, ETA, **UTR**, club matches, as well as, past season records will be taken into consideration. Make sure your league chairperson reports this information when he calls in his entries for the tournament.
4. Any coach or league that will not be sending representatives to the sectionals should notify the tournament director well in advance so a substitute may be found.
5. **Any TEAM that DOES NOT want to be considered in the team sectional tournament need to notify the section VI chairperson by email before the OPT OUT date of September 9th, 2026.**

6. All matches in the **individual** tournament will be **Best 2 out of 3 sets:**
GIRLS: All matches will use regular scoring.
7. **Balls** - Each single player or doubles team must provide a new can of balls for each match. The winner will take the **new can** of balls to the next match and the loser will get the old one.
8. **Placement into the draw** - Consideration, if possible will be made for players playing each other from the same team, same league.
9. Players must choose singles or doubles.
10. All players and their coaches must be at the tournament site on their assigned court within **10 minutes of the starting time** or they will **default** their match.
11. All players **who enter** this tournament must be **willing to play** in the Section VI Tournament and the State Tournament without defaulting for any reason except medical. Each player, **boys and girls**, must sign the **"Commitment to Compete" form** (see forms page 2) and submit it to his/her tennis coordinator prior to individual sectionals. Failure to comply **in Sectionals** will result in the loss of all rights and privileges associated with this event. ***In addition, the school's administration will be notified of any violation of this rule.***
11. **Size of Draw for the individual tournament** - 16 singles and 16 doubles. **Format:** This will be a single elimination tournament. Losers in the semifinals will play back for the 3rd and 4th position to determine the state team.
12. **U.S.T.A. Code of Conduct:** This code will be used during all play. This will be your only warning. Penalty: 1st offense - loss of point; 2nd offense - loss of game; 3rd offense - loss of match. **THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
13. **There will be an immediate disqualification from the Sectional tournament to any competitor who violates the "no practice rule" at the tournament venue on any day of the Individual Sectional tournament competition.**
14. **Warm-ups:** A ten minute warm-up will be allowed. It will be timed by the coaches.
15. **Continuous Play:** You are not to leave your court during play except with permission of the umpire or tournament director. In the case of a third set, the players will be allowed to leave the court for 5 minutes.
16. **Injury Time Outs:** U.S.T.A. injury time out rules will be used as a guideline. Three (3) minutes per injury before the point penalty system will be used for delay of match. A player may ask for one time out of three minutes for injury. If the player cannot continue after 3 minutes, a warning, then a point, then a game, then the match will be forfeited. The winning player(s) should report the score immediately after the match. She/They will also take the leftover new can of balls. These are kids and their safety and well-being is the most important factor when dealing with injuries.
17. **Rest breaks during match:** While players change sides - 90 seconds; 2 out of 3 sets - 5 minutes between 2nd and 3rd set only.
18. **Coaching during matches** - Coaching will be allowed on the 90-second change over starting with the third game of each set. Players **are not allowed** to leave the court; coaches **are allowed** on the court **during individual championships**. During the 5 minutes between the second and third set, players **are allowed** to leave the court. **(Girls Season only – Coaches ARE allowed to sit courtside during individual tournament matches.)** *A coach's job is to coach, not to be cheerleaders or interfere with play.*
19. **Minimum times allowed between matches** (a player may choose to play before that time):
 - 10 game pro set - 15 minutes
 - 2 out of 3 set matches:

1st round match	15 minutes
2nd round match	30 minutes
3rd round match	30 minutes
before final match	45 minutes
20. Tournament Advisory Committee will help enforce the rules and to take care of any unforeseen situations.
21. Proper tennis attire is required. Players must wear the following to participate:
 - **SHIRTS** -Tennis or athletic type with the name of the school that the player is representing must be worn. No shirts with anti-health pictures or names may be worn.
 - **SHORTS** -Athletic or tennis type shorts/skirts should be worn. **No cut-offs or boxer type shorts will be allowed to be worn during play.** (In case of warm weather, a player may change his shirt; in case of cold weather, a player may wear warm-ups).

THIS RULE WILL BE ENFORCED BY THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE.

There is no way I can list every possible event that may occur. Let's use some common sense, follow the rules and work together to ensure a fair and successful tournament.

New York State *Individual* Tournament Information and Rules

RULES

1. For 2026, the top 3 singles players and top 3 doubles teams from the State Qualifying Tournament will represent Section VI.
2. The State will continue the format to include medals for the top 8 finishers. The proposal for a playback was turned down.
3. **Transportation** must be provided by the district for the players. Please refer to [Section VI Travel to State Competition Policy](#)
4. **Meals:** Girls Tennis: Section VI will arrange for meals at the State Meet and bill each school for its athletes' participation.
5. Girls will use regular scoring throughout the entire tournament as voted on by the entire committee. Additional information will be provided at the State Qualifying Tournament. See [calendar on page 3](#) for dates and locations.
6. The Commitment to Compete Policy was updated by NYSPHSAA (May 2011) with more severe consequences for athletes that do not fulfill policy guidelines. **Commitment to Complete form in States.**
7. The NYSPHSAA Central Committee implemented the sanction of disqualification from the state tournament to any competitor who violates the "no practice rule" at the tournament venue on any day of the state tournament competition.
