FHS Guidance Update Friday, May 21

- Scheduling for 2021-22: A copy of student's course requests were mailed home so parents could review student course selections. Any changes (or mistakes) to these requests were due to the student's counselor by 5/7 so course requests are now final. Student's schedules (with periods and teachers) will be mailed home at the end of June.
- College Credit Plus (CCP): For students planning to take CCP classes next school year, please visit our website for the required steps. Students who are missing requirements have received that information this week and should get this taken care of as soon as possible.
- <u>Summer School</u>: <u>registration paperwork</u> and payment are due to the office as soon as possible. There are still a few spots open in Financial Management. Students who have failed classes: we'd love to see them get signed up for Credit Recovery this summer.
- AP Testing: AP testing has wrapped up for the school year! Students have received information about how to access their scores online in July as well as how to indicate which college they want their free score report to go to (must be done in MyAP by June 20).
- Pre-ACT for 9th & 10th Graders: Scores went out to students in Advisory on 5/13. Please review the information with your child!
- <u>SENIORS</u>: Seniors have been asked to complete a survey from the counselors to update us on future plans, how to get in touch after graduation, etc. Students also received a video with instructions on how to request a final transcript in Naviance (college-bound students). If seniors haven't already taken care of this important task, they need to do so as soon as possible.

Warren County Rental Assistance Program

Last week the Warren County Board of Commissioners launched the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. This program is administered through Warren County Human Services and is designed to provide rent and/or utility assistance to eligible residents who have experienced economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Attached you will find a press release, information specific to renters & landlords, and a social media graphic to utilize at your convenience. Please help us spread the word about the Warren County Emergency Rental Assistance Program.

PROGRAM INFORMATION:

- Applicants must live in Warren County and have fallen behind in rent and/or utility payments due to the financial hardships of the COVID-19 pandemic
- Individuals may receive up to 15 months of rent and/or utility assistance, including no more than 12 months of rental or utility arrearage payments
- Only arrearages accrued after March 13, 2020 are considered eligible expenses
- All applications are subject to a needs and income assessment by a program case manager

- The program launched on April 5, 2021 and is set to run through the end of the year or until funds are depleted

2020-2021 Free and Reduced Lunch Paperwork:

We have multiple families that have still not submitted their Free and Reduced Lunch Applications for the 2020-2021 school year. We suspect this is because all students get

free lunch this year. However, without that paperwork on file, we cannot waive students' school fees. In addition, our percentage of students that qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch is tied to our state and federal funding, and we want to make sure the percentage we receive is a true reflection of our students and families. Information on Internet Assistance:

This program allows for assistance with Internet costs, whether broadband or even cell phone. It covers your regular government assistance programs, but also covers ANYONE (less \$99K for single and less \$198K for joint) that was furloughed or had a loss of income since February 29, 2020. Information about FJHS Open Houses

The current Franklin Junior High building has been Wildcat Country since it opened as a 6-12 building in 1921. Franklin residents talk about themselves, their parents, grandparents, and even great grandparents attending classes there. The Franklin Board of Education, administration, and staff are aware of the community's affection for the building and invite the public to tour it before pre-demolition work starts later this summer.

- Three tour dates will be offered: Sat., May 1, 3 to 6 p.m.; Wed., May 19, 5 to 8 p.m.; and Sat., May 22, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- Tours are free, but for COVID safety, entrances will be timed and guests are asked to use this link to reserve tickets. http://bit.ly/FJHSOpenHouse For those who are unable to attend one of the tours, a virtual tour of the building will be available starting May 1.
- Members of the National Junior Honor Society will be on hand to answer questions and direct visitors throughout the building.

- The tour will end in the FJHS gym, where memorabilia will be on display including the Franklin High School class composite pictures covering the years from the mid-1920's to 1967; these currently hang in the Hampton Bennett halls, and will be eventually moved to the new high school.
- Additionally, some sports memorabilia including old uniforms and trophies will be available for sale in the FJHS gym as a fundraiser for the athletics department

The Franklin Junior High building, 136 E. Sixth Street, is slated for demolition later this year, as it makes way for a new Franklin High School campus on the current FJHS and Hampton Bennett properties. The new high school is part of a \$130 million project to replace or totally renovate the district's buildings, with the state of Ohio paying 57% of the project. This is being made possible by the bond issue that passed with overwhelming community support in November 2020.
