Christina Perozzi was the Edwardsville girls track and field program's first state champion.

A 1990 graduate of EHS, Perozzi won back-to-back state championships in the 300-meter low hurdles at the Class AA girls track and field state meet in 1989 and 1990. She was the first and second state champion in program history. Not until Emmonnie Henderson in 2010 did the Tigers have another individual state champion.

In 1989, Perozzi won the state championship in a then state record of 43.56, which lasted until 1994. In 1990, she won in 43.57.

Perozzi also took fifth in the 200-meter dash in 1988, second in the 100-meter high hurdles in 1989 and third in the 100-meter high hurdles in 1990. Overall, she was a five-time state medalist.

Perozzi's win in 1990 was followed shortly after by the baseball team's state championship.

Perozzi didn't begin competing in hurdles until her junior year. In high school she was coached by Pete Evans and Babe Stahlhut.

After graduating from Edwardsville, Perozzi attended Indiana University and competed in track and field. She graduated from Indiana in 1994 with a major in journalism and speech communications.

Perozzi currently lives in Chicago and operates her company 44 Larkmoor Creative, a digital marketing agency. She was previously the director of e-commerce for Goose Island Beer Company.
