Bond and Mill Initiative Q & A Gordon Jones	The BOE has adopted these 2 resolutions to be on the November ballot. The Fair Campaign Practices Act is now in effect. We cannot advocate for or against tax payer time. District Overview: 30 schools, 2k+ staff, 15k+ students, 362 sq. miles, 2.5m sq. footage managed, 91.1% graduation rate, \$19.3m in scholarships awarded (class of 2024). We are in 3 different counties.	No decision required

	Planning Overview: 2022: Gathered facilities data (repair needs, what is immediate and what is not) database has 5000+ items on it. 2023 - May 2024: Defining Options & Gathering Community Input (Master Planning Committee, Magellan Strategies, polling company) We polled the community on \$150m, \$250m, \$350m. We decided on \$220m. May - August 2024: Finalizing Proposed Investments Total Ask: \$220m: \$74m growth, \$78m educational enhancements, \$10m security, \$58m maintenance Educational Enhancements: Career & Technical Education (CTE) provides opportunities to personalize students' education, ventilation upgrades help enhance the educational environment. We are looking to add on to TCC (Thompson Career Campus) and looking to bring other programs offered through our CTE program. We did receive a grant from Larimer county and Bohemian for CTE. Growth: BES, IVES, TMS. Most of our growth is happening in Berthoud. BHS has enough room for growth without adding on right now. (There is a decline by about 1% of students per year. This is less than the decline statewide.) Maintenance: This only reflects our most urgent and critical needs.
