- The CC thread is split between informed speculation and rudimentary hypothesis, although the word "rudimentary" literally means "elementary," and, considering how the author drew from numerous historical records, "rudimentary" doesn't exactly fit.

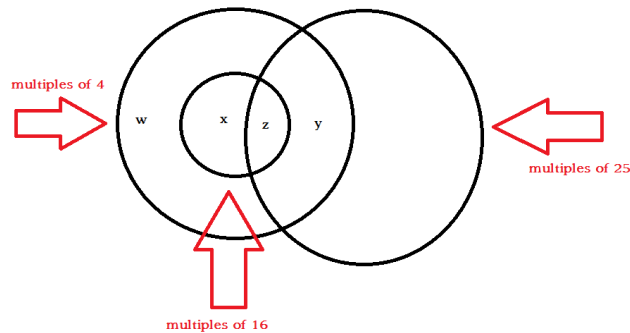

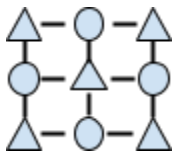

On triangles and circles (3x3 grid) -- 8

- I got 6 using algebra- anyone explain?
- Yes; $4x + 4(2x) = 96$ The middle triangle is 4 times the circle. The corners are 2 times the circle. $12x = 96$
- Yup^
- Wait, what was the 96 the sum of?
- ^All of the triangles.
- Aw, I misread it as the sum of all the shapes
- ^It was certainly a hard one for most!
- i skipped that one. and the walking ne. and the leap year.

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On **box with sides 2a, 2b, and 2c** with volume $2v$ -- **2a, 2b, and c (Answer choice E?)**

On **6 little circles ($r=6$) inscribed inside a larger circle ($r=18$)** -- **108π**

On **two triangles + circle (finding perimeter of larger triangle)** - **60**

- So we know that the given triangle is 15 and 9. 15 being the radius of the circle too. Therefore, through proportions, we know that the bigger triangle the side that was 9 on the smaller triangle is now 15. Therefore, $15:9 \rightarrow 25:15$ or $5:3$. And by Pythagorean theorem we know that the last side is a 20. it is 3,4,5 right triangle.
