Vocabulary Exercise:

- 1- Work in groups of three or four to create a restaurant menu using 15 vocabulary words from your list (you have it somewhere, or it's on the back of this sheet). Each meal description must give the reader a "clue" to the word's definition.
- 2- Divide the tasks/words up in a fair fashion— suggested task division on the following pages—HOWEVER <u>you</u> <u>must each learn all the words on your menu well.</u>
- 3- Make sure your menu items *explain* the words thoroughly—you can use them in the titles or the descriptions—as long as you define them well and use them properly (grammar matters!).

Vocabulary Menu Assignment Groups of 3 or 4 (no pairs or groups of five allowed).

Task: Take 15 of your vocabulary words from Huck Finn (see examples) and use them to create a "Finn-ish" Menu!

Example of how you turn a word into a delish' dish:

1- Choose the Vocabulary Word from your Huck Finn list (this example is from

another book)

disdainful (adjective): describes a person who: feels superior/ looks down on others.

2- <u>Use it in your menu in such a way that everyone get the meaning without using a traditional definition.</u>

Example of a Menu Item that defines the word *disdainful*:

<u>Disdainful Veggies –</u>

Filled with vitamin "C" for "Contemptuous"
Try the daily offerings for a snooty bunch of snarky nutrition! *Today*:

Cooked Carrots drenched in butter and a sense of superiority.

Menu Tasks and Grading Rubric*

Each group must complete their menu within the 60 minute timeframe: 30 minutes today/30 tomorrow. Group member jobs could be divided as such:

1 Comment Recorder: Records suggestions/comments made by each individual, and writes the final copy.

1 Task Leader: Keeps the group talking about the menu and vocabulary words; researches definitions.

<u>1 or 2 Presenters:</u> Research definitions and presents the group's menu in front of the class with class and a plan—no "here is our stuff" type nonsense—present well.

*If you are not actively participating in the group's discussion and research, you will be asked to complete the assignment alone.
