

THE WILD WEST AND SCENIC SOUTHWEST NATIONAL PARKS TOUR



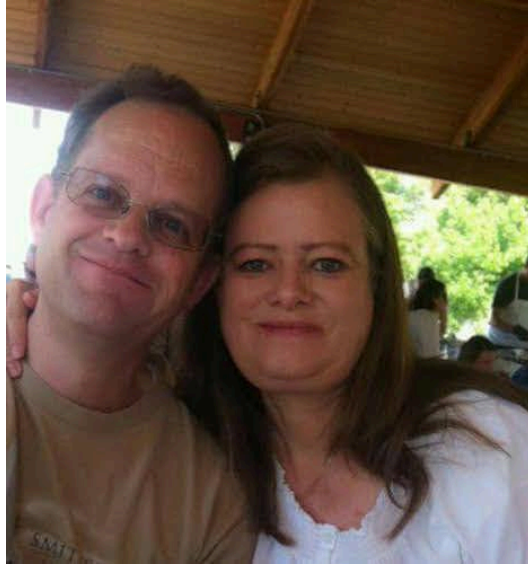

ITINERARY

Day 1 – Fly to Salt Lake City and meet the Family



Fly in to beautiful Salt Lake City, then we will take you to the quint little town of Morgan, Utah where you will now be a part of our family for 8 days!



This evening, and throughout the evenings each day, you will be adopted into our family unit. You will enjoy typical American family food, such as roasting hot dogs over a campfire, and don't forget the s'mores. There will be a hamburgers, biscuits and gravy, BBQ, clam chowder, apple pie, and more.



Other evening activities include singing songs, telling interesting stories, and funny skits around the campfire. Also playing board games, singing songs at the piano, or maybe watch a Western movie filmed near our home.



Day 2– Old Western Trails through Wyoming and Utah

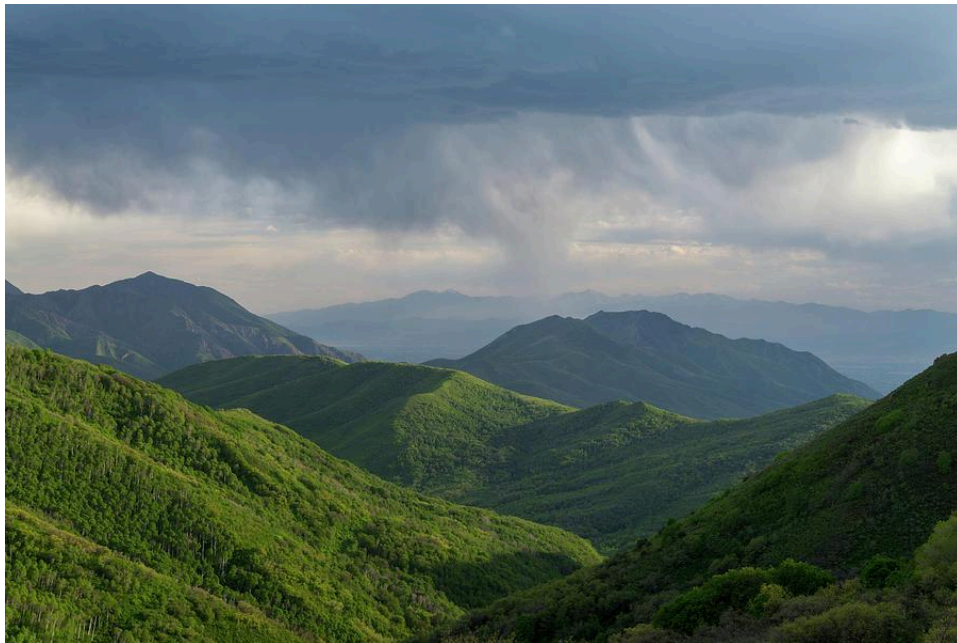


Nothing says cowboy more than the State of Wyoming, the official “Cowboy State.” We will begin our western adventure in Fort Bridger (a 19th-century fur trading outpost established in 1842. It became a vital resupply point for wagon trains on the Oregon Trail, California Trail, and Mormon Trail).





We will continue on back into Utah with historical stops along the way to hear fascinating stories as we stand in the exact spots of the original routes of the Donner Party, Pioneers, Pony Express, Stagecoach, and Train.



Next we will have a real cowboy teach us how to rope “Bob” his fake cow. And if you are brave enough you can try your hand at roping Bob’s brother “Bobbie” a real calf.



Day 3 – Union Station Museums, Golden Spike, and Antelope Island



Toot! Toot! Today we will visit the famous Ogden Union Station, hub of a once bustling intercontinental train system. It includes four museums - old automobiles, guns, trains, and cowboys. Next walk down historic 25th Street for food and souvenirs. Beware you might hear a frightening ghost story or two at the Union Station, as well as at the historic Ben Lomond Hotel, if you dare to enter!



On to the Golden Spike National Historic Site. This iconic spot commemorates the completion of the first Transcontinental Railroad joining of the rails spanning the continent was signified by the driving of the ceremonial Golden Spike.



On to Antelope Island in the middle of the Great Salt Lake. You might see an antelope, but you will for sure see a Buffalo, and get to touch the Great Salt Lake.



Day 4– Horse Rides at This Is The Place Pioneer Park, Temple Square, Bridal Vail Falls

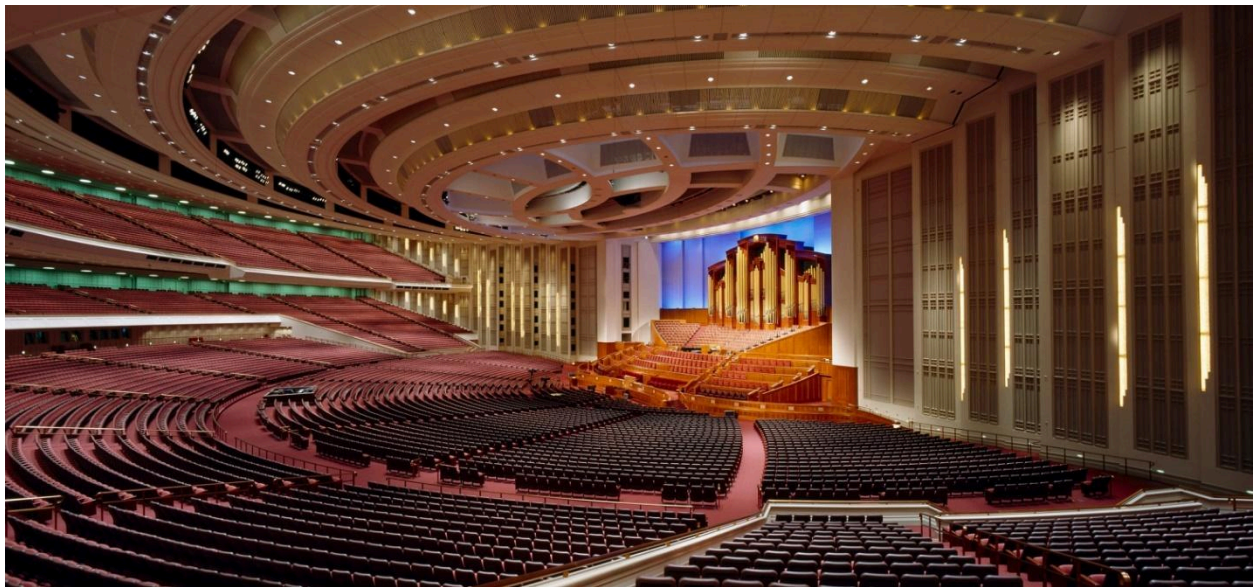
Back to finish up on the Pioneer trails, we will go to This Is The Place Heritage Park. The location of the park is where, on July 24, 1847, Brigham Young first saw the Salt Lake Valley, which would soon become the new home for the Mormon pioneers. We will tour original and replicas of the pioneer village. Next a one hour scenic and historic trail ride on horses.



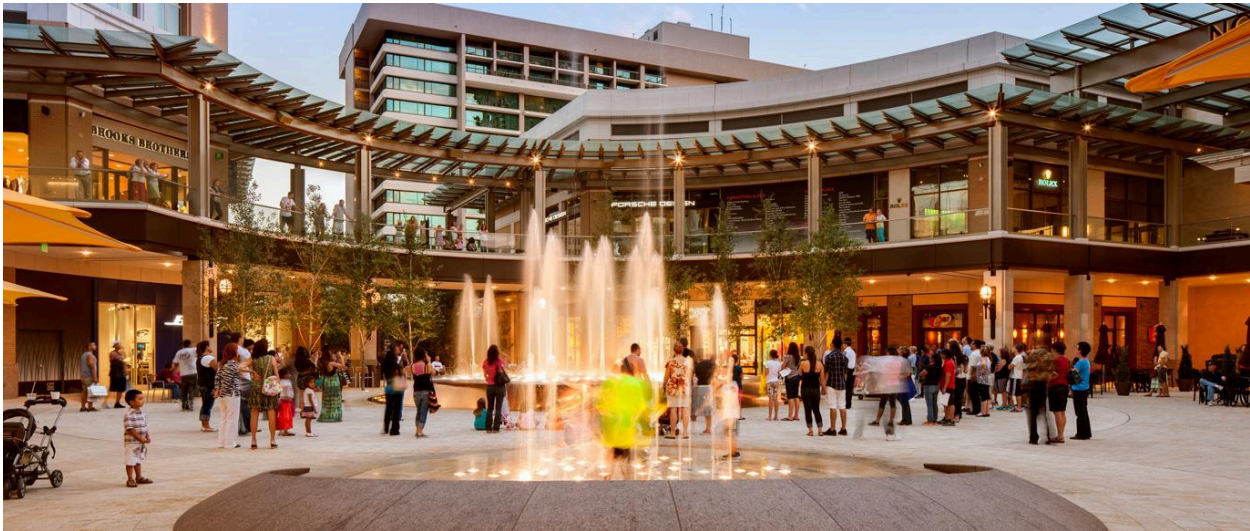
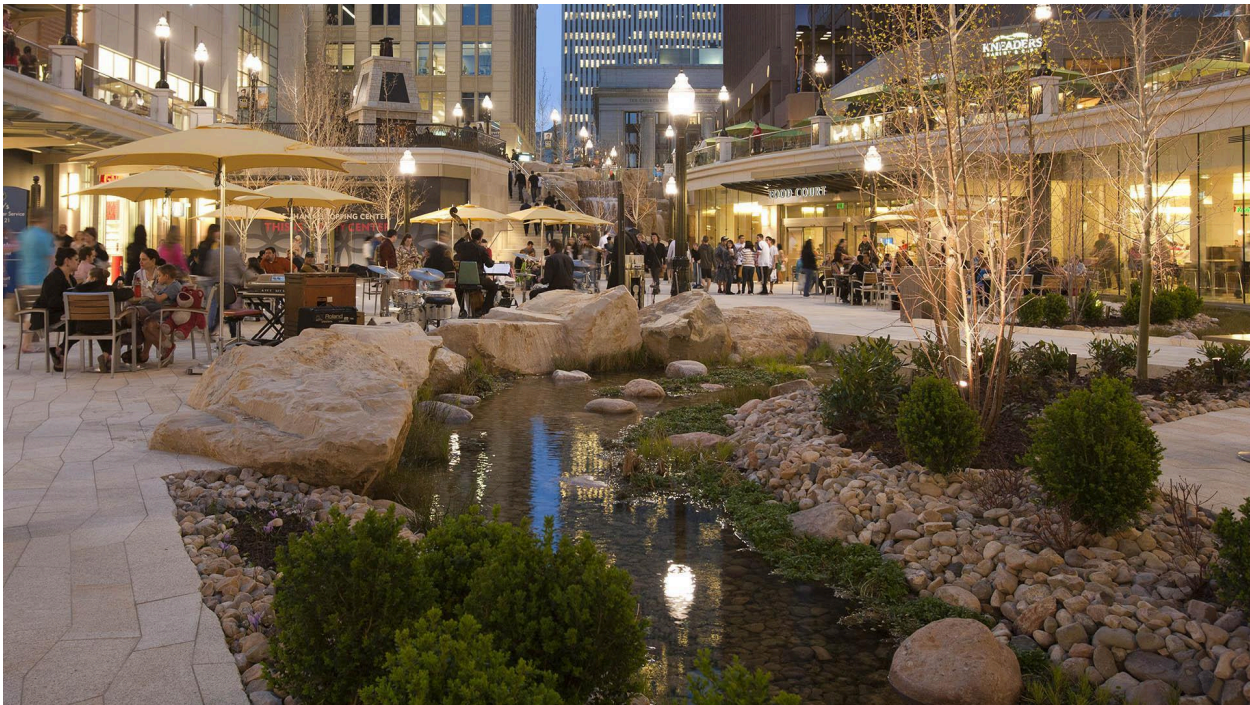


Then we will go downtown Salt Lake to see the results of the magnificent city that the Mormon Pioneers founded. Sights include tours of The Salt Lake Temple, Conference Center, Family History Library (find out if you are related to any famous people like Nicolaus Copernicus, Frederick Chopin, or Pope John Paul II) and much much more to see.

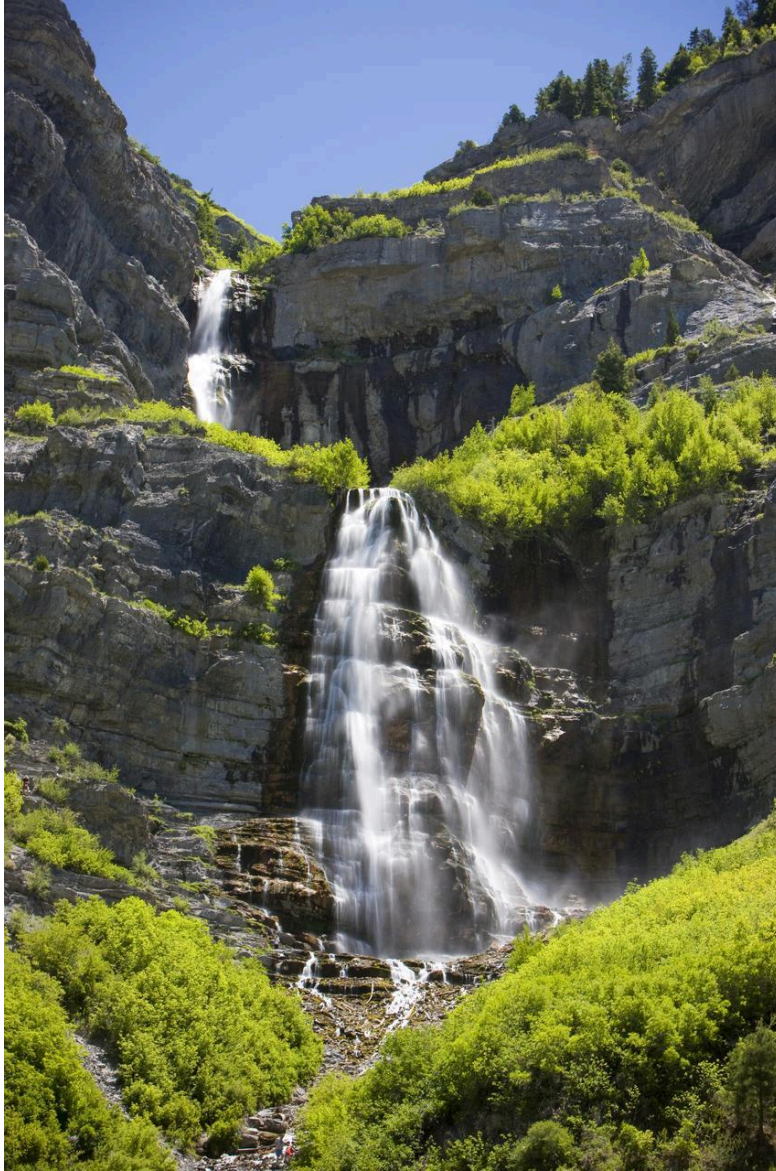




You can get souvenirs and lunch at City Creek.



Leaving Salt Lake City we will make a stop at Bridal Vail Falls, near Provo.



Day 5 – Outlaws of the Wild West and Arches National Park

Now begins the second part of the tour, four fantastic National Parks.

As we spend three days touring the National Parks you will hear stories along the route of the Wild West gunslingers and outlaws. Including Utah's most famous outlaws Butch Cassidy and The Sundance Kid.



The world famous Arches National Park. Formed over millennia, the unique features of Arches National Park astonish and delight its many visitors. Find yourself dwarfed amongst the giant archways and delicate rock formations. Arches National Park offers the largest density of natural sandstone arches in the world.



Arches National Park contains over 2,000 natural sandstone arches! Throughout the park, rock layers reveal millions of years of deposition, erosion, and other geologic events.



Day 6 – Arizona, Navajo Bridge, Vermillion Cliffs, Grand Canyon

Walk across the historic Navajo Bridge high above the Colorado River.



And see real live Native Americans with their souvenirs to sell.



Then to Vermillion Cliffs National Monument - This remote and unspoiled 280,000-acre monument is a geologic treasure with some of the most spectacular trails and views in the world





Today's adventure continues with one of the natural wonders of the world, The Grand Canyon!

Grand Canyon is considered one of the finest examples of arid-land erosion in the world. The canyon is immense, averaging 4,000 feet deep for its entire 277 miles. It is 6,000 feet deep at its deepest point and 18 miles at its widest.

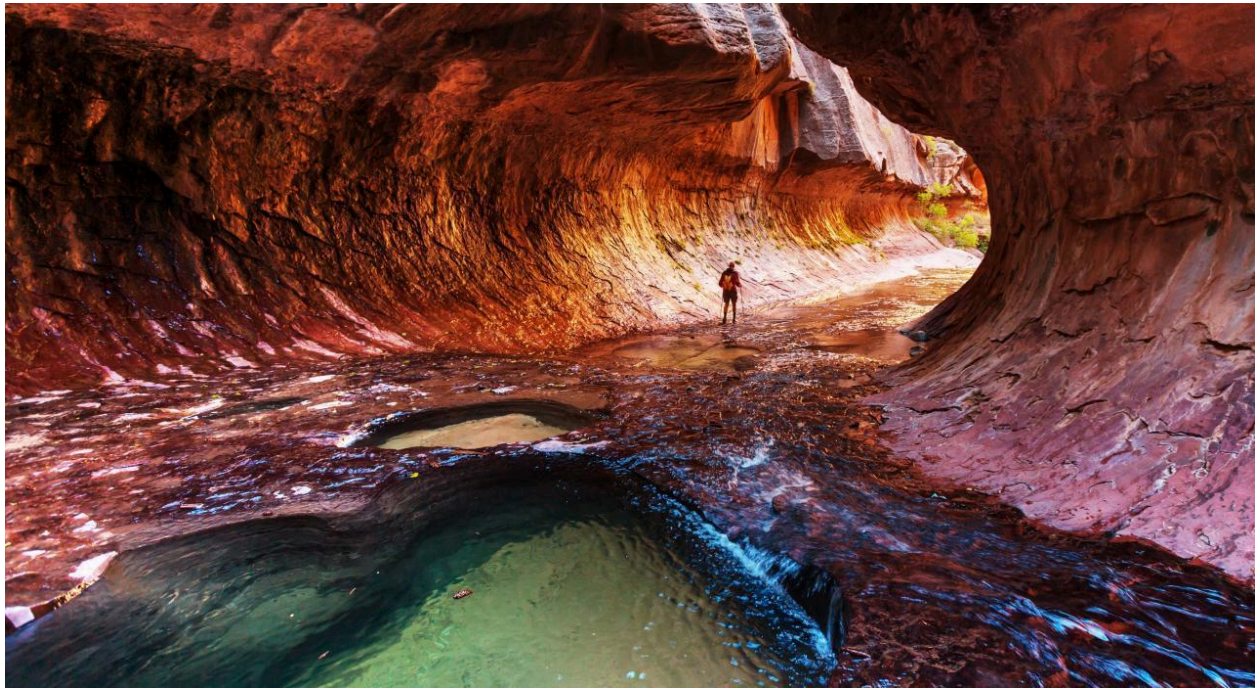


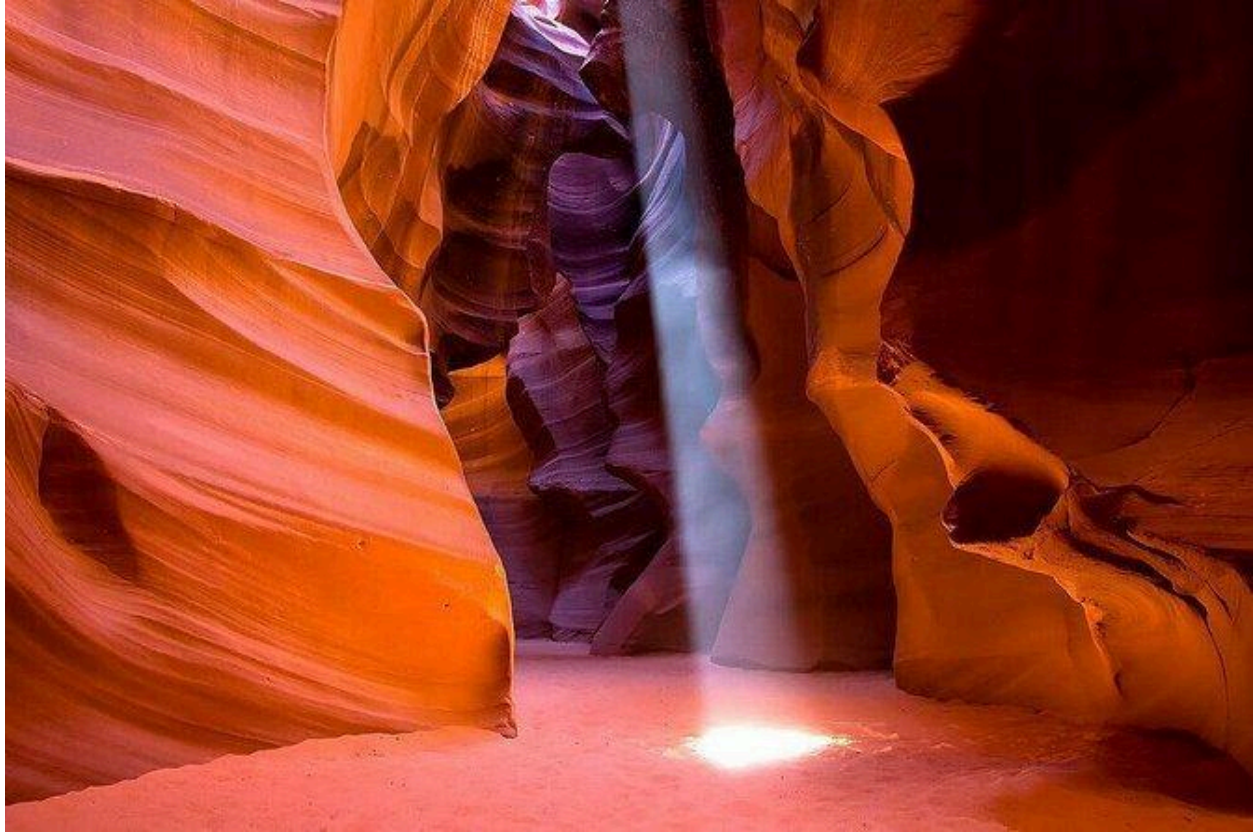
Grand Canyon is one of the most studied geologic landscapes in the world. Get your cameras ready for an incredible scenic sunset picture.



Day 7 – Zions National Park

Zion National Park encompasses some of the most scenic canyon country in the United States. Within its 232 square miles are high plateaus, and a maze of narrow, deep, sandstone canyons. Zion also has 2,000-foot Navajo Sandstone cliffs, pine- and juniper-clad slopes, and seeps, springs, and waterfalls supporting lush and colorful hanging gardens.





In the evening we will attend a real live Rodeo! Events include Bareback Riding, Bull Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Tie-Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, and Cutting.



Day 8 – Cove Fort, Drive Back to Salt Lake International Airport and Fly home

As we head north, we will tour Cove Fort, (one of its distinctive features is the use of volcanic rock in the construction of the walls, rather than the wood used in many mid-19th-century western forts. This difference in construction is the reason it is one of very few forts of this period still surviving).



And then time to say goodbye as you fly back home to a completed once in a lifetime adventure. Come back in a year or two for the next exciting tour!
