College Portals

Be sure to carefully read ALL your emails from the colleges to which you've applied. The colleges will email you about a week or so after they have received and processed your application with instructions on how to set up a portal, through which they will communicate important, time-sensitive information to you. Colleges often do NOT communicate through your regular email. Create these college-specific portals, check them weekly, and follow up immediately with anything requiring action on your part. Also, check your email address which you submitted with your college applications, because some colleges do communicate with you through your personal email.

Testing Reminders



The ACT and SAT are still optional for many colleges for 2022 admissions due to Covid-19, noted in an Inside Higher Ed article seen here, but be aware that many other students nationwide will be taking the tests and submitting scores. If

you are applying to a competitive college or major, it may be advantageous for you to

take and submit your scores. You may have to travel farther than Marin to an available test center. **The staff in the CCC recommends that all students take either test** if it is at all possible unless you are only applying to CSUs. The CSUs will <u>not</u> consider SAT or ACT at all in their admissions decisions this fall.

Recommendation Requests on the Common App



Many students have asked where on the Common App they can find the recommendations requests to send to counselors and teachers. Below we have outlined some commonly asked questions about the common app that might make it easier to navigate!

- Under the "Common App" tab, you must fill out the first few "pages" in the Education section.
- Then, enter at least 1 college under the "College Search" tab, which then will appear under the "My Colleges" tab.
- Under the "My Colleges" tab, click on the name of 1 college. Under "Recommenders and FERPA", first select the box that says you'll waive your FERPA rights (very important this means that you will not see your recommenders' letters, which gives the recommender privacy this is what colleges want).
- Continue on to the next screen which asks for your counselor's name and email.
 Click on a box that indicates that the counselor will be contacted directly by the Common App.

This process should be done for each teacher that will be a recommender, too.
 For many colleges, students can choose an "Other Recommender" who is NOT a teacher, but a coach, employer, supervisor, clergy, etc. We highly recommend this option to students.
