- 3. Agenda Items to discuss
 - Student Handbook Review (Pages 3-18)
 - The idea of an "open campus" was not supported by our BOE. The Board would like to ask the SDMT to be creative in thinking of other senior lounges/privileges outside of allowing the students to leave and return.

Handbook will go to BoE at the next meeting on 8/16/22 for potential approval. Cheryl shared she was happy that it was decided to not make it an open campus, and she would like to see students be engaged in other opportunities during their time at school such as college courses or other activities. She also felt it poses a safety concern for students to leave and return. In the past, there has been a Senior Lounge with different iterations of what this entailed.

Eligibility in the Code of Conduct has seen major changes; specifically, it will now include grades being pulled on Mondays and include only two levels of ineligibility. The goal is to see students get help sooner, so regardless of level students are expected to attend the after school intervention room for help. Students will maintain the ability to become eligible at any point via the "pink sheet". Additionally, Mr. Flynn and Ms. Irish will now meet with students who are ineligible.

Discussion came back to the Senior Lounge and use of the stage plus the additional space off the stage that was formerly the Yearbook room.

It was supported by the committee that a Senior Lounge return to the stage and allow our students some independence and a space to talk and socialize with peers.

• Fundraising Schedule

o Ms. Basford, Extracurricular Advisor

It is reported that community members feel there are too many fundraisers and that the same individuals or groups are being hit to support fundraising. Discussion included that, at times, there are several monthly PTO and trap fundraisers scheduled in addition to our school based extracurricular group fundraisers. It was shared that PTO and trap fundraisers do not have fundraisers scheduled as part of the School's Fundraising Schedule. These groups provide Mrs. Basford with their fundraisers and calendar dates. It is believed that this came about when the PTO picked up paying for field trips and other things when the district experienced cuts in funding. The suggestion was made that fundraising for PTO should be expected to schedule fundraisers as part of the District Fundraising Schedule. This was felt as reasonable because staff at school are often required to pass out fliers and collect money and all the funds go towards district events for our students. It was reported that trap has an even heavier amount of fundraising and pointed out that, unlike PTO, the funding doesn't support all students like PTO fundraisers do. Staci will look to reach out and share this with both organizations to explore how to meet the need to prioritize fundraising and impact on those contributing to fundraisers.

Fundraisers cover the cost of:

Ammunition alone for the Fall 2022 season cost us \$3,000. In addition to the cost of ammunition, there are also league fees, club fees, cost of clay targets, uniforms (jerseys, shirts, sweatshirts and jackets), tournament

fees, banquet, awards and more. If you add up all the costs it comes to over \$500 per team member each season (2 seasons each year - Fall and Spring) with between 23-25 team members each season.
