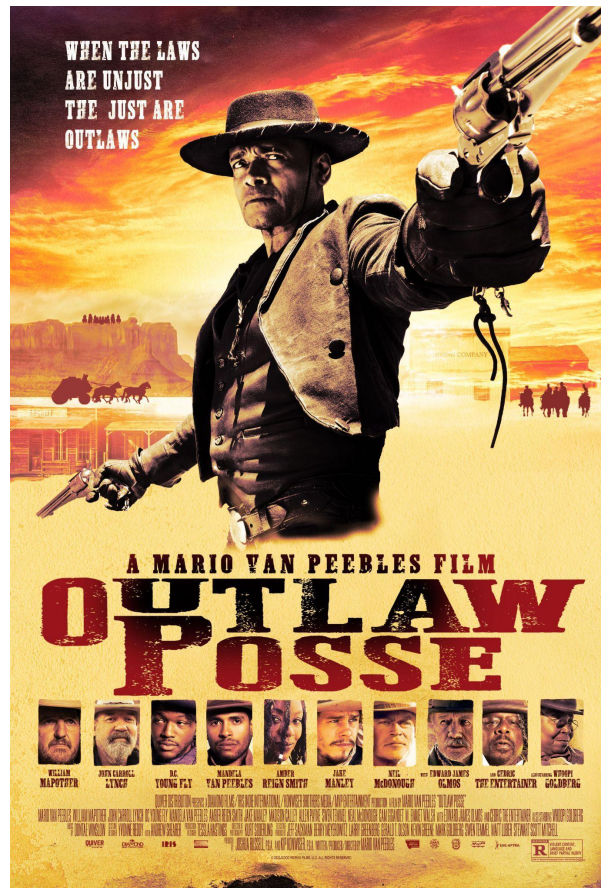

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Short Synopsis

1908. Chief (Mario Van Peebles) returns from years of hiding in Mexico to claim stolen reparations gold hidden in the hills of Montana but is chased by Angel (William Mapother), whose rationale to the gold leaves a trail of dead bodies.

Long Synopsis

Chief, a badass gunslinger with his own brand of justice (Mario Van Peebles) has been laying low in Mexico. He decides to return to the American West, and assemble a misfit posse of Outlaws to pursue a chest of hidden Confederate gold. The diverse group includes Southpaw (Jake Manley), a left handed quick draw expert, Spooky (DC Young Fly), a bawdy vaudeville performer, Carson (John Carroll Lynch), an enforcer and former partner-in-crime, and Queeny, (Amber Reign Smith), a knife-wielding saloon girl. Unfortunately Chief's sadistic arch nemesis, Angel (William Mapother), who has a sick passion for vengeance and Beethoven, catches wind of Chief's plan. Angel hunts down Chief's estranged son Decker (Mandela Van Peebles), takes his classically trained wife (Madison Calley) hostage (making her his personal violinist), and forces him to agree to infiltrate Chief's posse, serving as his spy. While on the trail, the outlaws find outrageous ways to use their diversity as a strength, like Chief convincing Spooky to join with Southpaw by posing in 'white face' to rob a bank disguised as the notorious Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid. But, when that plan goes awry, in an unexpected twist, Chief's son Decker shows up to help the posse escape, thus securing his infiltration into the group. At an outpost run by the wiseman Ossie (Edward James Olmos), their horses get stolen forcing them to hitch a ride with the wiley frontierswoman Stagecoach Mary (Whoopi Goldberg). That leads them to the utopian barter town of Lil' Heaven, run by Horatio (Cedric the Entertainer), where they recruit the outcast dynamite expert, Jeremiah (Allen Payne). Meanwhile, Angel and his evil iron brigade trail closely behind. Chief and his posse finally reach the vast mines containing a maze of tunnels where they unearth the precious gold. Decker also learns the truth about his backstory with his father, but before Decker can reveal that he is actually a spy for Angel, Angel surprises them. The old arch-enemies finally come face-to-face. Father and son have to unite as the Outlaws, outmanned and outgunned, are forced to pull out all the stops, fighting for more than just their own lives.

Director's Statement

America's race-ocracy seems to be making an ugly comeback with teacher censorship, legislative obstruction, and voting rights under renewed attack. Of course, during the turn of the century women of any color were not allowed to vote and men of color could be jailed and their homes burned just for exercising their right to vote or even own land. As our characters say in "Outlaw Posse": "When the laws are unjust the just are outlaws!"

That said, the Wild West was not only brutal, it was also multicultural with approximately one out of every three or four Cowboys being black. As such, I wasn't drawn to the reductive, traditional, whitewashed westerns, and I didn't want to make a black western that was "reactive" to those pictures either. I was excited by the idea of seeing all of us. This, in some ways, mirrors the colorful diversity I grew up with in my own crazy family. I wanted to tell a father-son story inspired by the Johnny Cash song, "a boy named Sue," and informed by my own experiences as both a son and a father. To keep it grounded, I tapped my own actor kid, Mandela, to play my on-screen son – much like my own father did with me in "Sweet Sweetback." If America is a melting pot, then I wanted to cook this cinematic gumbo with laughter, love, and jalapeños. At the dawn of the century, we were all here -- and it will take all of us to fulfill the promise that we originally dreamed up. Yeah, it's true: today many of us are divided. We don't break bread together or feel safe making fun of ourselves. My old man used to say "It's boring to just hang out with people who look, think, and vote like you," but that's where a lot of us are at. I'm still a pessimistic-optimist. We may not watch the same news, or even share the same facts, but my hope is that some of us can still have that illusive beer summit, where we bring our expectations down low and enjoy the same raucous ride through the wild wild West together. And who knows, maybe we'll come out the other side a little less divided.

About the Cast

Mario Van Peebles

Mario Van Peebles is a consummate filmmaking Renaissance man. "When you grow up in a by any means necessary independent filmmaking family, you've got to learn to do it all," says Van Peebles. Mario broke out as an actor in Clint Eastwood's "Heartbreak Ridge". He played political icon, Malcolm X in "Ali" directed by Michael Man. Mario's directing feature debut was the gangster classic hit "New Jack City". He followed that up by starring in and directing his bold black western "Posse"- which also featured his film making father Melvin. Mario teamed up with his dad to make the feature "Panther" about the rise of the Black Panther party for self defense. Mario directed and produced, Melvin wrote and produced. The acclaimed controversial film is now a cult classic and won the Silver Leopard award. Mario wrote, starred, produced, and directed "Baadasssss!"- the odyssey about his maverick father's making of his game changing film "Sweet Sweetback's Badasssss Song!". Playing your own father is like psychotherapy on celluloid," jokes Mario. "Baadasssss!" received Ebert and Roepers best movie of the year award. Van Peebles wrote, starred, produced, and directed the indie feature, "Armed" which challenges the powerful gun industry. In it, Mario plays a self proclaimed "Good Guy" with easy access to meds and weapons of war. An advocate for education and environmental justice, Van Peebles produced "Bring Your Game" for at-risk youth. "Mario's Green House" chronicles he and his family's humorous attempts to go green in materialistic Hollywood. "We never got to full green, but we did get to Olive" says Van Peebles. "With this new wild western, the circle is complete," says Mario. "I got to do "Posse" with my dad and "Outlaw Posse" with my son Mandela. This life has been incredible. My father gave me my first lines in a feature film, and I gave him his last lines in a feature film."

John Carroll Lynch

John Carroll Lynch has worked with many great filmmakers including Martin Scorsese, David Fincher, Clint Eastwood, Miguel Arteta, Karyn Kusama, John Lee Hancock, Pablo Lorain, and the Coen Brothers (who cast him opposite Francis McDormand in 1995's Academy Award winning film "Fargo"). Most recently in film, Lynch played David Dellinger' in Aaron Sorkin's "The Trial of the Chicago 7," a performance Time Magazine hailed as one of the ten best of 2020. On television, John has appeared as characters that are villainous, scary, quirky, confused, and lovable. Highlights include roles on "American Horror Story," "The Walking Dead," "Carnivale," "The Drew Carey Show," Craig Zobel's "One Dollar", "Veep," and as both 'Rick' and 'Wolf Legarski' on two seasons of David E. Kelley's Big Sky. He can also currently be seen recurring opposite Julia Roberts and Sean Penn in the limited series "Gaslit" on Starz. Most recently, Lynch joined the cast of the FX show "The Border".

Mandela Van Peebles

Mandela Van Peebles can currently be seen starring in the SyFy comedy "Reginald the Vampire" as the vampire life coach to co-star Jacob Batalon (of Spiderman fame). His recent dramatic roles include Sam, in the critically acclaimed Taylor Sheridan and Antoine Fuqua-produced "Mayor of Kingston," alongside Jeremy Renner and Oscar-winner Dianne Wiest. He also played the historical character of Noah in the epic reimagining of "Roots." With Forest Whitaker and Lawrence Fishburne. Mandela gained worldwide attention as the affable Mitch in "Jigsaw" of the "Saw" movie franchise. 'Legacy' is what you think of

when you hear the Van Peebles name; third generation Mandela is definitely doing his part in upholding the family's cinematic lineage, which was started by his grandfather Melvin Van Peebles, known as the godfather of modern Black cinema. Following in the Van Peebles tradition of wearing many hats. Mandela has already directed a number of videos and is starting to produce as well. In "Outlaw Posse" Mandela gets to play his father Mario Van Peebles' on screen son. "This is a dream come true" jokes Mandela, "I grew up seeing my dad and grandfather in the western, 'Posse'. Now I get paid to ride as one of the Outlaws and give my pop a rough time on screen in front of Whoopi Goldberg!"

William Mapother

William Mapother has appeared in over ninety films and television shows. Recent film work includes the features "On Sacred Ground." (Fox Searchlight July '11 release), "A Warrior's Heart," "Edwin Boyd," and the comedy "FDR: American Badass." Other films include the Oscar-nominated "In the Bedroom," "Another Earth," "Son of Monarchs," "World Trade Center," "The Grudge," "Without Limits," and "Mission: Impossible 2." Some television work: "Lost" (as Ethan Rom), "FBI: Most Wanted, 9-1-1: Lone Star," "Lethal Weapon," and "MacGyver."

Allen Payne

Allen Payne is a well-seasoned actor, having done many films, commercials and television shows. He is best known for his work as the lead in the hit TBS show, "House Of Payne." He will next be seen in the revival of "House Of Payne"- "House Of Payne 2.0" where he will reprise his role as C.J. Payne. He can also be seen in other hit shows such as, "CSI: NY," "Commitments," "Fresh Prince Of Bel Air," and "The Cosby Show." Allen has also had a wonderfully extensive independent film career, whose credits include: "From The Outside Looking In," "Blue Hill Avenue and 30 Years To Life"; "Playas Ball" from Summertime Films; "The Perfect Storm" with George Clooney for Warner Bros.; Wes Craven's "Vampires In Brooklyn," "New Jack City" for Director Mario Van Peebles; and Robert Wise's "Rooftops." Allen is incredibly grateful to have been a working actor for over 20 years and is looking forward to continuing his illustrious career.

Amber Reign Smith

Amber Reign Smith is an American actress, director, and casting director who is known for "Open," "You Should've Told Me," "Kold and Windy," "Wu-Tang: An American Saga," "Rap Sh!t," and "Til My Casket Drops." Amber can currently be seen on "Complicated: Atlanta," "Judge Me Not," and Hulu's "The Other Black Girl".

Cedric the Entertainer

Cedric the Entertainer's film work spans genres from memorable performances in comedies such as the hit "Barbershop" franchise, "Johnson Family Vacation," "The Original Kings of Comedy" concert film which chronicled his record breaking Kings of Comedy Tour with fellow comedians Steve Harvey, D.L. Hughley and the late Bernie Mac; to dramas like Paul Schrader's critically acclaimed Oscar nominated drama "First Reformed," co-starring Ethan Hawke and Amanda Seyfried; and his signature baritone voice in animated hits such as Disney's "Madagascar" and "Planes" franchises, "Ice Age 2" and "Dr. Dolittle 2," among many others.

Edward James Olmos

Edward James Olmos has achieved extraordinary success as an actor, producer and humanitarian. The Tony®, Emmy® and Academy Award®-nominated actor is probably best known to young audiences for his work on the SyFy television series *Battlestar Galactica* as the iconic “Admiral William Adama.” Although the series kept the actor busy during its run from 2003 through 2009, it didn’t stop him from directing the HBO movie *Walkout* in 2007, for which he earned a DGA Nomination in the Outstanding Directorial Achievement in Movies for Television category.

Olmos’ career in entertainment spans more than 50 years. In that time, he created a signature style and aesthetic that he applies to every artistic endeavor, often grounding his characters in reality and gravitas. His dedication to his craft has brought him attention across the industry and with audiences worldwide.

Originally a musician, Olmos branched out into acting, appearing in many small theater productions until portraying the iconic “El Pachuco” in *Zoot Suit*. The play moved to Broadway and Olmos earned a Tony nomination for the role which he reprised in the 1981 film version. Olmos went on to appear in the films *Wolfen*, *Blade Runner* and *The Ballad of Gregorio Cortez* before starring in one of his most memorable roles, that of “Lieutenant Martin Castillo” in the iconic ‘80s television series *Miami Vice* opposite Don Johnson and Philip Michael Thomas. During his time on the Michael Mann series, Olmos earned two Golden Globe® and Emmy Award nominations, resulting in a win from each.

In 1988, he was nominated for an Academy Award and won the Golden Globe for his portrayal of “Jaime Escalante” in *Stand and Deliver*. He directed and starred in his first motion picture, *American Me*, in 1992.

Olmos’ passion for the arts grows every year, but he never forgets to give back to the communities that support him. He is an international advocate, spokesman and humanitarian working with organizations such as Thank You Ocean, Project Hope Foundation, Children’s Hospital of Los Angeles, The Boy’s and Girl’s Club of America, The River Keepers, Dr. Andros’ Diabetic Foot Global Conference and he speaks up to 150 times a year in schools, universities and corporations.

Other credits as an actor include the motion pictures *My Family/Mi Familia*; *Selena*, which was a breakout film for Jennifer Lopez; and *In the Time of Butterflies*, in which he played Dominican Republic dictator Rafael Leónidas Trujillo. In television, he is bringing gravitas to *Mayans M.C.* He enjoyed a recurring role as U.S. Supreme Court Justice “Roberto Mendoza” in the NBC drama *The West Wing*, portrayed a widowed father in the PBS drama *American Family: Journey of Dreams* and *Dexter*. He directed the YouTube phenomena “The Short Film BP Doesn’t Want You to See,” featured on Larry King/CNN.

Between 2019 and 2020, his film releases included *Windows on the World*, which he executive produced and starred in; *Walking with Herb*; *Monday Nights at Seven*, and he produced, directed and starred in the all-star cast of *Devil Has a Name*.

Whoopi Goldberg

Whoopi Goldberg is one of an elite group of artists who have won the Grammy, the Academy Award, the Golden Globe, the Emmy and a Tony. She is also a prolific producer, bestselling author and entrepreneur and she is well-known around the world for her many humanitarian endeavors. Born and raised in New York City, she performed in San Diego and the Bay Area with the Blake Street Hawkeyes theatre troupe. It was there that she created the characters which became "The Spook Show" and evolved into her hit Broadway show, Grammy Award-winning album and the HBO special that helped launch her career.

Whoopi has recurring roles on Amazon's "Harlem" and the EPIX series, "Godfather of Harlem." She reprised her iconic role of Guinan in season two of the Paramount+ series, "Star Trek: Picard" and lent her voice to the recent animated features "Luck" (Apple TV+) and "My Father's Dragon" (Netflix). She starred in the 2020 adaptation of Stephen King's best-selling novel "The Stand," and she appeared in and produced the critically-acclaimed feature film, "Till," which has amassed countless awards and honors since its release in late 2022. She will appear in the highly-anticipated Amazon Prime Video series based on Neil Gaiman's "Anansi Boys."

D.C. Young Fly

Born and raised in Atlanta, DC Young Fly had the distinction of being named one of Variety's coveted 10 Comics to Watch for 2019. His expansive work in the comedy, acting, and digital spheres have made him a standout as an entertainment multi-hyphenate. As a comedian, actor, influencer, musician, and podcast host, DC has proven that innate comedic ability, abundant creativity, and a passion for generating laughter can be translated across multiple mediums.

DC's career originated by creating hilarious videos and roasts on Vine which he's translated into the successful brand that he is today. Currently he is the most sought after veteran cast member on Nick Cannon's Wild'N Out and has also been an anchor in the growth of the popular podcast, 85 South, which has a global fan base of over 2.4 million subscribers on YouTube, garnering 633 million+ views and 150,000+ live tickets sold.

He guest starred on both seasons of 50 Cent's BMF and also plays the historic musician/songwriter 'Sly Stone' displaying his musical talent on season two of BET's American Soul. In the feature film space, he played the lead in Universal's comedy feature for MTV, How High 2 and can most recently be seen in the remake of New Line and SpringHill's feature film, House Party. Other past acting credits include Will Packer's feature film Almost Christmas, FOX's comedy series REL, and Kenya Barris' Grownish on Freeform. In addition to Wild'N Out on the unscripted side, he's hosted MTV's reboot of TRL and has been a regular on VH1's Hip Hop Squares. He's also hosted back to back years in 2020 & 2021 for BET's annual Hip Hop Awards alongside his podcast co-hosts Karlous Miller and Chico Bean.

Jake Manley

Jake Manley may be best known for his leading role as 'Jack Morton' in Netflix's "The Order." He can currently be seen in Amazon's "The Consultant" alongside Christoph Waltz and recently starred in Lionsgate's "Pursuit" alongside John Cusack and Emile Hirsch. Jake can also be seen in Netflix's "Holidate," which was the top-streamed title during its debut weekend; and Roland Emmerich's "Midway" with Woody Harrelson, Dennis Quaid, Nick Jonas, Luke Evans, Mandy Moore. Jake will next be seen starring in Lionsgate's "Do Not Enter"

Madison Calley

Born in Washington DC, Madison Calley is an actress and world-class harpist. Madison is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon University with an extensive history studying music, acting, and business.
