FAFSA – THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID is a required step for students to earn a diploma from an Illinois High School.

FAFSA Completion Workshop- Monday December 9, 2024 - 6:00-7:00 pm in the High School Library. A Financial Assistance Advisor from ISAC, will help students and parents with filling out their FAFSA.

I parent and the student should have completed a FSA ID prior to this workshop.

Please bring the following; Social Security Number, Records of income for 2023 (see below), such as income earned from work and business, child support paid or received and any other untaxed income. If you have them, refer to the W-2 Forms or Federal Income Tax Return IRS 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ, Information about assets, such as savings, certificates of deposit, stock options, bonds, 529 plans and other college savings programs; and investment real estate, business and farm, Driver's license number, if you have one, Dates of birth, include the month, day and year. Month and year of marriage, separation, divorce or other change in marital status, Alien Registration Number, if your student is not a U.S. citizen.

*Applying is easier with the IRS Data Retrieval Tool! Students and parents who have filed their 2023 federal tax return will be using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to easily, accurately and <u>securely</u> transfer their tax information into the FAFSA form.

SENIORS NEED TO HAVE THESE 5 THINGS IN ONE EASY TO ACCESS LOCATION.

1. Social Security #, 2. WCHS code 143847, 3. HS Transcript of grades (Parchment account), 4. SAT score report, and 5. Complete inoculation records. These will be used for applications, scholarships, enrollments, etc.

- 9-11 PRE-REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR will be conducted in February. Students need to start planning for next year's courses. Remember, required classes that are not passed this semester will have to be taken again next year. Talk to your teachers about class options and prerequisites.
- 9-12 XELLO CAREER EXPLORATION Not sure what career you want to pursue? Hit the XELLO button on "Counselor's Corner" under the Career Planning Tab. Here you can explore your own personal career options. Using your own interests, personality type and learning style this program will help you explore careers that match your wants and needs. It will help you decide what type of training you will need whether it is "On the Job Training" or Post-High School education in a college of some sort. With this program, you get to be in the driver's seat.
- 11-12 ARE YOU AN 18 YEARS OLD MALE? If you are, you must register with selective service. You can register as early as 17 years and 3 months old. You are required by law to register. By doing so you will be eligible for student loans and grants, job training and government jobs as well as avoiding a 5-year prison sentence and up to \$250,000 fine.
