## **Parking Permit Transition FAQ**

### **How does this change affect parking eligibility?**

This change doesn't affect eligibility at all. Everyone currently eligible for parking remains eligible. You can read more about eligibility here <https://go.lbl.gov/parkingeligibility>

### **What do we do if we're renting a car or borrowing someone's car?**

It is highly recommended you register the rental or borrowed vehicle plate in advance, or Security can assist you at the Lab gate.

### **How will enforcement work if someone parks in a green circle, ADA, or carpool place without the appropriate placard? How will enforcement know who the vehicle belongs to?**

Every personal vehicle driven on-site will be [registered](https://hris.lbl.gov) with Site Access at <https://hris.lbl.gov>. As a result, Security will know the owner of every vehicle and will issue citations or contact owners accordingly.

### **Will carpool spots be impacted and will physical placards still be required? How will they be monitored?**

Daily carpool permits will be issued at Lab gates to vehicles with at least two active Lab badges and one individual with regular-hours parking privileges. These permits must be displayed to park in a carpool space. Carpool spaces will continue to be patrolled every morning.

### **How will stacked parking be enforced?**

Stacked parking enforcement will remain the same: Everyone is required to display a stack parking permit or facsimile that lists their name and contact info.

### **How will enforcement work in the horseshoe lot? How will we ensure that campus employees are not parking there?**

Requirements to park in the horseshoe lot are the same as parking within the Lab gates. Security patrols this lot daily and will review a sampling of plates each day.

### **What if people use car-share services, such as Lyft or Uber?**

### **What do I do with my old parking placard?**
