CALCUTTA RULES AND INFORMATION:

- Each participant has received a handicap number between -6 and 17. The Bardmoor tennis staff and consultants decided upon these handicaps.
- A blind draw will be held to decide pairing before the auction. The team handicap will be the sum of the two individual handicaps paired from the draw. No team can start with negative points.
- EXAMPLE ONLY: If a combined amount of \$10,000 has been collected during the auction, \$1000 for Charity , \$1000 for the winning pro, the prize amounts would be:
 - 1st Place (50%) - \$4,000
 - 2nd Place (30%) - \$2,400
 - 3rd Place (10%) - \$800
 - 4th Place (10%) - \$800
- The highest bidder for each team is responsible to pay for the team at the conclusion of the auction. Only the PRO reserves the right to buy back a quarter of the team once it has been purchased. Owners are not required to sell half of their team to the amateur they purchased. Team ownership should be settled before play begins on Saturday. All money winnings will be distributed following the finals.
- 24 teams will be placed into 6 divisions, where 3 rounds will be played.
- A round robin format will be used with teams playing in their respective divisions. Each player will serve five points in a row. If the starting score is not a multiple of five, i.e. – if the score is 4-0, then the first server has only one serve. Play is to 31 points. **The most a team can start down is 17-0.**
- Handicaps are used for starting scores. For example:
 - Team A – 20 points combined handicap
 - Team B – 9 points combined handicap
 - Team A will begin the set with an 11-0 lead and will serve four points
- If the score is 30-30, the next point wins.
- Both 1st and 2nd place teams of each group will advance to the round of 16 on Sunday. The top two teams from each group (12 teams total) advance to Sunday's elimination rounds. Of the 6 first place teams, 4 of those teams with the highest bidding amount from the auction, will receive a “bye” in the round of 16 and will automatically advance into the quarterfinals.
- The Round of 16, Quarterfinals, Semifinals and Finals will play one set to 31 points on Sunday.

RULES FOR START OF PLAY

- If a team is down by a seven point or more deficit, the team starting down has the choice to serve or return.

Example: Team A has four points to start the match, Team B has zero points to start match. Team B has the choice.

RULES ON DETERMINING WINNERS

The winning team out of each group will advance by RECORD first. Ex. One team undefeated.

- If there are two teams tied, it goes to HEAD-TO-HEAD between those teams.
- If there is a three-way tie, the team with the MOST POINTS IN THEIR LOSS advances.
- If there is a tie after that, it goes back to head to head between the two teams.

RULES ON OWNING TEAMS

- Buyers who own two or more teams in the same bracket, will have the option at the end of the auction to slide their team to another bracket, but on the same line.
- ONLY TEAM OWNERS PAY their winning bid amount to the tournament table on Friday night.
- If players want to purchase part of their team, that transaction is done solely between the owner and the player, there is no involvement with the tournament table.
- If, as a winning team owner, you have other investors that buy into your team, that transaction is done solely between the team owner on the placard and the other investors, there is no involvement with the tournament table.
- ONLY TEAM OWNERS pay full amount of winning bid for team to the tournament Table.

PRO PLAYER LIST

Mark Singnil

Mark was a former top-10 player in Thailand and played #1 at the University of Toledo. He is now the proud owner of his business One Stop Restaurant Solutions. Mark has a huge forehand and serve, and will be one of the top pros this weekend.

Alex Robles

Alex is a tennis coach at Henkel Rock Tennis. He is a former player for the University of Wisconsin and has a huge serve and forehand. This year, he needs to win the title to prove his worth to his new wife, Caylee.

Jeff Mager

Jeff is the host of Marley's Milestones Calcutta in Fort Lauderdale. He is a former Florida Gator tennis player with a lefty serve that when he hits it on Saturday, it doesn't hit the service box until Tuesday! Don't be fooled by his slow serve, he's a veteran to this format and typically makes a run on Sunday.

Andy Lake

2023 CALCUTTA KING!! After 25 years of playing, Andy finally won a title! He is trying to become the first back-to-back winner at Bardmoor.

Matt Rock

Former #1 player for Florida Gulf Coast University, Matt has a great serve and poaches more than anyone in the event. Matt always has a great first day, but can he repeat his performance on Sunday? If so, it's his year to take the title.

Junior Cervantes

A former Tusculum College standout, Junior is no stranger to the calcutta format. In a field of 40 earlier this year, he made the quarterfinals at Marley's Milestones Calcutta in Fort Lauderdale.

Damon Henkel (+1)

Damon was 2020 Calcutta Champion! Unfortunately, he hasn't won a single match since! He gives a new meaning to the phrase, "has been". In spite of his recent struggles, he is still a stud.

Scott Allen

A Tampa native and 2021 CHAMPION in this event, Scott is always the hardest one to handicap in the field. He has a great lefty serve that's difficult for the pros and the amateurs. If you're playing with him or against him, bring a helmet because racquets will be flying.

Stephen Felman

One of the most consistent players in the field. Stephen was a semifinalist in 2023 and always makes the second day of the event. He'll need to win the money to pay off the engagement ring he gave his new fiancée, Elizabeth.

Courage Okungbowa

Courage is a former #1 player in singles and doubles at FAMU. With his big game, he was a semifinalist at the Orange Bowl, where he beat Novak Djokovic's younger brother. He has an incredible return of serve so servers beware!

Chris Henderson

Chris is back in action after a two-year hiatus. A former Furman standout, Chris has arguably the best hands in the field. He has a great lefty serve and he is a veteran to the calcutta format.

Thomas Blake

Thomas is a former #1 player for Harvard University and was a top-200 player in the world. He has a cannon for a serve and he is unexpectedly fast for how tall he is. He is also the brother of 7-foot-2 Dikembe Mutombo.

Tianyu Bao

Tianyu is a former #1 player for Florida Gulf Coast University who graduated with the second-most wins between singles and doubles in FGCU history. Tianyu is Yao Ming's brother with an absolute bomb for a serve.

Kyle Hoffman

A veteran to the event, Kyle is one of only four players to play in every year of Bardmoor's Calcutta. He was a top-10 player in Florida and has a massive forehand and serve. He's in the best shape of his life now, which is surprising because he's been married for a couple of years.

Luciano Musella

Originally from Riva del Garda, Italy, Luciano played at Brown University after being one of the top-10 juniors in Italy growing up. Luciano and Matt Rock grew up competing against each other as kids on the courts of Holiday Park. Let's see if they get to square off in the race for the crown!

Jason Hood

The owner of Advantage Yours Tennis shop, Jason is a former Florida State University standout. He has an all-around solid game with great volleys and is deceptively fast. Go see him at his shop for all of your tennis gear!

Sebastian Castillo-Sanchez

Former #1 player at RPI, Sebastian was ranked as high as #9 in the nation. In his final year, he made the All-Conference First Team in singles and doubles while being named an ITA All-American. He has one of the lowest handicaps in the field.

Michael Alford

Michael is a former University of Florida standout, who had 86 overall singles wins with the Gators, which was eighth-best in program history at the time. Michael was a high-school state doubles champ with Ben Hwang. He has a big serve and a very crafty backhand.

Ben Hwang

Ben played #2 at Johns Hopkins and had a high ranking of 15 in the country during his collegiate career. Ben is a three-time high school state champion with Michael Alford and was the Tampa Bay Times Player of the Year.

Gary Kushnirovich

Gary is a former #1 player at West Point Military Academy and former #3 at St. John's University. Gary won a conference championship playing for both programs. He was also a team captain during his time at St. John's.

Alejandro Feliciano

A former top player from Puerto Rico, Alejandro is a very deceptive player with great volleys and touch. He is a great fisherman, so we'll see if he can catch a great partner to win this year's calcutta.

Gerrit Disbergen

The South Africa native is no stranger to the event. Gerrit is a multi-time winner of this calcutta format. He's a typical South African with great hands and has a very crafty playing style.

Timothy Phung

A freshman at the New College of Florida in Sarasota, Timothy is the youngest and the highest-rated player in the field.

Brian Kowalski
