

Kenosha Unified Athletics – Hall of Fame Inductee – Class of 1989

Jeff Carswell – 1977

Tennis was the only sport Carswell participated in while at Tremper, and he played it exceptionally well. He lettered three times, received the MVP award three times, was named all-conference twice and was team captain as a senior. He played No. 1 singles for the Trojans and compiled an 89-6 record over three years. He ruled the South Shore Conference No. 1 singles competition as a junior and senior and wound up with a 35-1 record in league competition. He won three sectional titles at No. 1 singles and finished fifth, fourth, and second in successive years of state competition. In his senior year, he lost the No. 1 singles championship match at state to Leif Shiras, who is now a touring professional.

He enrolled at the University of Wisconsin in Madison and won two letters. He played No. 6 singles and No. 2 doubles, and in his senior year, placed second in doubles at the Big Ten Conference meet. An excellent student, Carswell ranked among the top 10 in his Tremper graduating class and in the top 10% of his class at UW, where he earned an engineering degree. Carswell now is an engineering consultant for IBM in their Technical Support Center in Minneapolis.
