RECOMMENDATIONS

GROCERY: Raley's is huge and has everything from goggles to golfballs. Prepared Food too! Village Market off of Southwood near Post Office has a great butcher and sandwiches.

DINING: Recommend taking advantage of pre-6 pm happy hours around town. At least one early dinner or dockside drink so you can see the lakefront sunset at Lone Eagle Grill (Hyatt) or Big Water Grill (up by Diamond Peak). Great Pizza across from Hyatt (they also deliver) at Tomaatos. Lone Eagle also does appetizers and a fire pit on the Lake... nice. BITE is delicious, T's Rotisserie by Movies is low budget yummy! If you have to watch sports... Go to Rookies at the Raleys Center - every sports fan in town will be there. In winter - Diamond Peak has a grill on the deck you can access without skis, and in the summer, try the Chateau at the Championship Golf Course sitting on the deck overlooking the 18th green. A drive to Crystal Bay will find Mellow Fellow for beer lovers. Other good recommendations on www.yelp.com

MOVIES: There is a theater in town by the 7-11. Movies change every Friday.

SUMMER TOYS: You can rent almost anything at the Hyatt – bikes, kayaks, jetski's, boats, etc. Not as cheap as heading into Kings Beach... but you're here! Beach toys and floats are in the trunk outside your door. Please do not take kitchen items to the beach.

WINTER TOYS: Diamond Peak (.5 miles off Country Club) has great Lake views and is rarely crowded. There is a shuttle that stops right in front of High Sierra. Check Diamond Peak website for schedule as it changes. Full rental, lessons and parking. Northstar, Squaw and Heavenly Shuttle at the Hyatt in case you want to leave your car here.
