

# Step One: Your Testable Question

Before you proceed, you should have completed the three items found on the Requirements for Both Types of Projects page 10. Now you will fine-tune your testable question.

Look back at your question, your research, and any other information in your logbook. Edit your question. Make sure spelling and grammar are correct. Record it in your logbook. Be sure to date your entry and label it.
