February 2021 Activity Report

In February, our activities included **caring for the young vegetable plants on the farm, finishing roof repair of two classrooms destroyed by Cyclone Eloise, finishing the final details of the classroom, organizing the materials & building the education building at the Cyclone Idai resettlement camp, & preparing programs to begin meeting in March.**

☐ **Preschool (Garden of God Preschool):**

We still have kids to enroll but stopped for some weeks because of the government lockdown. Our community continues to work diligently to get our new education building ready in time to have classes start on March 19.



Blocks are made by hand, mixing cement, water and sand from the river bed. It will take about 4000 blocks to complete the 3 room building.

☐ **Literacy and Bibles Ministry:**

We are still enrolling women and men, until March 15th.

☐ **Soccer Team (Garden of God Academy):**

Led by our lead preschool teacher, Izaquel, our soccer team was formed in 2019. This team morphed into an academy...in addition to soccer training, the **140 youth** enrolled learn social and relationship skills, Bible, tutoring, English lessons and hygiene.

☐ **Choir Group:**

Once we are able to meet together again, we will divide into two groups of 30 and each group will attend practice 2 days per week.

☐ **Pastor Ministry:**

We continue to study from home.

□ Sewing Program (Vinde e Vede):

We are still not meeting, but continue to make masks for the communities.

□ Farming Activities:

We are preparing the soil to plant our next succession of vegetables in March, such as **beans, cucumber, cabbage, lettuce, beetroot, kale, green peppers and carrots.**

□ Sheep's Gate Church:

We continue to meet two days a week to pray together. We go out in the community to visit brothers and sisters. Please pray for our sister Luisa, whose daughter had eye surgery, brother Green whose wife is sick and sister Helena, whose daughter is very sick.

Please continue to pray for wisdom and health for our church family, as we are facing hunger this season because of lack of food in the community. Food is very expensive in Mozambique.

□ Animals



- Duckies- we have 54 ducklings and 41 eggs waiting to hatch.
- Chicken- Our 60 chicks are doing well & our broody hens are diligently setting.
- Turkeys- we now have 28 eggs, between our four females
- Pigs- We had 4 piglets born! We have two more pregnant females who are due in March

We continue to be so thankful for those who partner with us through prayer and financial giving.

We thank Jesus for the lives of every person connected with our project in any way.

We also provide spiritual care for people by doing regular home visits in the community to teach the Bible, to pray and to demonstrate love by meeting practical needs through whatever means we have available. We praise God for the opportunity to share His love in our community because more lives are reached for Jesus.

Finally, please keep in view and in prayer the ongoing needs of the communities in this rural area, which include: **health care (the hospital is around 7km away), lack of permanent shelter after Cyclone Idai from 2019, insufficient Bible knowledge, education, malnutrition, lack of hygiene in general, clean water and food poverty.**
