8:00 – **Welcome and acknowledge newly elected officers**

8:30 AM

Notes from Mike on what we will accomplish and work on this year. Decision: focus on meetings broadly.

Key here: programming at national meetings. We're losing a day and we should promote posters better.

Regional Meeting: we're too reactive and not proactive. Let's reach out and maximize the impact of our presence at those meeting.

Workshops: relevant, trendsetting, serve members, and generate revenue.

Treasurer's Reporting (Coltrain)

8:30 – ● 2019 Budget Review

AM For those who don't know: we have investments and we pull from them as we need to. Awards is a big area.

2019 we have small budget surplus. Why? Workshops paid off (Thanks Lesia!). Still though: allocations down and membership is down.

Our income stream is really membership, allocations, and workshops. We need to work on this.

Allocations fluctuate and the calculus is fuzzy math.

"if you have a lot of posters you can get a lot of money"

Workshops vary year to year but we made about \$90k this year.

Q: is it useful for to look at all these numbers?

A: yes it is.

MACRO thing at ACS Philly is oddly impacting the budget based on how money is coming in and out across 2 years

POLYED is still open we need to talk to how to spend it.

- 2020 Budget Initial Review

We're going to assume membership and allocation are steady, and \$10K for awards.

Symposium support: we always guess \$28 but it's always a risk that we'll get hit harder.

Investments: we're going to pull later to balance the budget.

MACRO2020 Philly thing is a question mark but we'll see. It seems that this will be fine more on that later.

Pacifichem is a big spend this year.

If we're prioritizing regional meetings we should be putting more in here too.

Workshops are looking good (estimating conservatively)

Newsletter sponsorships are down. Seems like sponsorship is down in general.

Proposal: ask the sponsors what advertising would be better for them.

Q: Did workshop sponsorship translate to a loss in newsletter support?

A: yes in part.

Proposal: can we put together a sponsorship package where we offer different levels and put advertising in several places?

in a way we already do this with workshops. Worth a discussion.

Proposal: put this on the webpage with a description and a note that we are nonprofit.

So bottom line: we are projecting **-\$192K** (without MACRO and pacifichem it's still **-\$141k**)

Downward allocation trend: For allocations and membership there is supposed to be a floor so that is good.

We've talked about how to get more of the pie but since it is relative to other divisions this is hard to predict.

Posters seems to be a way to really up this number. We underperform here. We've discussed this before.

We have a number of slides on this. We can talk about it then. This is a larger discussion.

Side discussion on posters and programming

Digital showcase. Digital posters? Stand in front of a screen. A few slides. It seemed cool. Future faculty session? IAB?- a couple of good points:

Future faculty thing is a culture change, we'd need to invest in it.

Digital posters are great but mechanics are hard.

Back to budgeting:

Is our membership too expensive? It's the highest one, is that why people don't join? We should discuss this. This is a major budget item.

Proposal: lowering it doesn't make sense. Should we raise it and by how much?
Anyway... to be discussed with membership

The key here: increase income and reduce expenses.
There are several suggestions on the table but most of these are just a few thousand dollars.

- o Considerations for Pacifichem

Historically we have supported this and we are getting requests already. This can be budget neutral but it is always a risk. They usually intend to support the divisions.

MOTION: To receive symposium support from POLY at least one organizer needs to be POLY a member. Organizers will be encouraged to promote POLY membership to their speakers.
Carried unanimously.

Discussion points

- should we require speakers to be members? Little support for this
- This could be much more impactful for the division than supporting the normal national meetings.
- We should require this for all symposium
- What are some unsuspected consequences?

- Business Office

The business office rocks. Period.

Proposals: should we support professional development opportunities for the business office. Classes, etc? There is support for this.

Proposal: Can we chose to redirect eschewed reimbursements to the business office?
Proposal: Can we have an idea of what professional development opportunities are available, desirable, and how much it costs? Or we suggest what is available?

- Investments

We have been hanging around \$1M for several years despite withdrawing to balance the budget.

Discussion on the international fund. ~\$30k. Yes we are still discussing this. Discussion focused on using this money, finding ways to spend this line item down and get it off or sheets. Finally.

IUPAC MACRO2020 is a potential place to spend some of this.

Put this out to the international committee. We will discuss and vote on this in Philly.

MOTION: We resolve to spend down international account in 2020. Roughly budgeted \$20k pacifichem \$10k for MACRO in Philly.
Carried unanimously.

General question on ACS: they make money but don't provide a ton of support for the divisions. Please, sir, can we have some more? (from allocations).

Turns out this is a bylaw and would require a vote by the board of directors. That bylaw came when most of that money came from membership. Pubs feels like they are under pressure from open access.

You don't have to be part of a division: has this come up?

A: yes. You are automatically placed in a local section. This could happen in the divisions too.

ComSci: Science and technology subcommittee and programming: There are opportunities here and it doesn't cost us anything. They also write public policy statements. There is a high-level subcommittee on awards we can get involved in. Also a subcommittee of communications that Diana chairs. It's been good interacting with them in the past so we should keep this interaction going and be aware of this.

- POLY Workshops Review of 2019 and overview of 2020 and beyond

We did really well in 2019. In fact historically we have done really well. The workshops for 2020 look good. Projecting \$48.8k net proceeds.

- Webshops

This was successful. We didn't hit the numbers we wanted but still we made money.

- Graduate Research Polymer Conference
 - Looks like this will be a successful conference. There is an IPG Grant request consideration for a thesis competition at this meeting (Knauer).

Discussion: For large workshops that raise a lot of money can we put a small administrative fee on the money raised beyond a certain amount? They are more work.

Other perspective: this is trying to squeeze more out of something that already works well. This might turn off the organizers if you tax their money.

Approval of the Fluoropolymer Workshop. There is a succession plan for organizers and the new organizers are ~~thirsty~~ eager for a successful event.

MOTION: Approve the Fluoropolymer Workshop Proposal

We have a \$2000 budget for this. Historically this support comes informally and reactive. We could be much more proactive.

These are great meetings (SERMACS especially) and it's really an untapped resource in many ways. Young faculty go, many students give their first talk at these meeting.

It would be great to be visible here. Reach out to SE/SW regional in NOLA (Oct 2020)

Other ideas: YCC centric. High school teacher training. Student chapter organized events?

Could we have a workshop on how to start student chapters at regional meetings?

We'll be updating the webpage to add regional meeting organizing to our programming portfolio.

In general, it would be good to have folks from each region that could champion this and get them involved in POLY.

- o Science Cafes (Mitchem)

This was born at a strat planning session. \$200 for a gathering about science/networking event, etc. very few of these groups applied for it in the "correct" way. Usually a request came in and we fit it into the Science Café budgeting category. Put this on the chopping block. We could punt this to the student chapters and have them organize these. Or regional meetings. What we need are champions for this.

Motion: discontinue funding Science Café.

Carried unanimously.

MPPG: we need a committee member on this or doing this. It's an important meeting.

National Programming

Philly is rough dude to ACS giving us 7 room instead of the 9 we asked for. Otherwise programming looks solid.

Some interesting data. Attendance isn't strongly correlated with the total number of concurrent symposia. # of symposia and half day sessions has grown.

Proposal: cut general topics and force some posters.

San Fran: room pre assignments. We get 7 rooms.

San Antonio: Tuesday will be a trial block schedule

Atlanta: block and no Thursday

Generally the discussion moved to the way ACS is handling these changes and how we will adjust. How can we adjust our culture? For example, limit the number of half days per symposium, limit for number of talks a person you can give, etc. There is broad support for making some of the changes as long as it is gradual and not onerous.

M&E seems to be pushing toward bringing everyone to the convention center. Reduce footprint, cost, impact, etc.

ACTION ITEM: communicate to membership and organizers that we will be restricting the number of half day sessions in symposia. This will be done in a variety of ways including the newsletter. Mike Meador to lead in drafting this letter, and programming chairs to follow up and Justin to add to web. This will include hard deadlines.

The timeline and workload for programming is bananas. We need to talk about this and figure out how to take pressure off programming chairs. Communication between the ExCom and programming chair needs to be better. Breaking some of the information discussed at the programming lunch off to a separate meeting with ExCom is a good idea. In general we need to improve communication here. This is especially important when a new person comes in. Strong preference from the current programming chairs to have say in appointing the new programming chairs.

Posters: we need to figure out a way to add value and make this desirable. We should maybe have an experiment for San Francisco.

Idea: seeking post doc poster session. Broad support.
Invited poster experiment.
Posters with the plenary?
Appointing a poster task force.

Switching up the org chart to aid this is desirable.

Expensive but money is rolling in.
