Terms of Reference June 2021

Context

Multiple researchers, agencies and organizations in the Northwest Atlantic are conducting vulnerability assessments for a range of different purposes, spatial scales, and approaches.

Mandate

The Northwest Atlantic Vulnerability Hub [NavHub] is a collaboration between Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and the Centre for Marine Applied Research (CMAR). Our objectives are to:

- Connect scientists, managers and industry leaders, who are developing, applying and using vulnerability assessments in support of decision-making
- Exchange technical information on approaches, methods, and datasets related to vulnerability assessments
- Develop practical guidance on how to operationalize vulnerability assessments in support of decision making in the Northwest Atlantic.
