"Tragedy in the Park: Independence Day Turns Deadly in Manhattan"

Our top story tonight: a tragic incident in Manhattan's Lower East Side has left the community in shock. On the evening of July 4th, a substance abuse counselor from New Jersey, Daniel Hyden, drove his gray F-150 truck into Corlears Hook Park, resulting in the deaths of three people and injuries to eight others¹².

Witnesses say the 44-year-old Hyden was speeding on Water Street before blowing through a stop sign and crashing into the park where families were celebrating Independence Day¹. The victims include a mother and her son, identified as Lucille and Herman Pinkney, along with Ana Morel²

Hyden, who has a background as a substance abuse counselor and author, was reportedly involved in an altercation at Pier 36 earlier that evening. <u>Denied entry due to his intoxicated state</u>, he left the venue, leading to the tragic crash about 50 minutes later¹.

He now faces multiple charges, including driving under the influence, vehicular homicide, and assault¹². Authorities have confirmed that Hyden was not wearing a seatbelt and had a suspended license at the time of the crash¹.
