## Wildcat Family,

What a week! We made it through a 5 day week back with students. We have been so impressed by how quickly our students have found their routine, and the amount of teaching and learning already taking place throughout the building. Our overall attendance this week was 93.9%, which is phenomenal. Families, thank you for all of your support at home to help make this week such a success.

#### FHS/FJHS Joint Campus

For the next two years due to construction throughout the district, our campus will house grades 7-12. Grades 9-12 will be in the high school building, and grades 7-8 will be in a modular campus located behind the high school. Adding two grade levels to our campus will deeply impact student arrival and dismissal. When we start on August 16th, grades 7 and 8 will be attending remotely. We anticipate them to begin attending in-person around Labor Day. Please look for updates on arrival and dismissal protocols as we transition to supporting grades 7-12 on one campus. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

## A Day in the Life at Franklin High School:

We can't wait to welcome students on Monday August 16th. To help make the start of school less stressful, we have included information about what a "typical" day looks like at FHS.

- FHS Main Office Hours: FHS Office Hours are Monday-Friday 7am-3pm
- Covid-19 Protocols:
  - o Masks: At this time, masks are optional in the school building.
  - o Per federal mandates, masks are mandatory on school busses, regardless if someone is vaccinated.
  - FCS 21-22 Reopening Framework
  - o Warren County Health Dept. Guidelines as of 8/9/21
- Arrival: We will open the doors for students daily at 7:15am. If students arrive before 7:15am, they will not be permitted in the building until 7:15am. Once they enter the building, they can go get breakfast or report to the appropriate designated location.
- School Hours: Our school day runs from 7:30am-2:35pm.
- <u>Tardy Bell:</u> The tardy bell rings to start the day at 7:30am. Typically, students will start their day in 1st period unless we are running a modified schedule.

- Breakfast: Breakfast will be served daily in the cafeteria from 7:15am-7:30am.
- <u>Dismissal:</u> Buses typically pull out of our parking lot by 2:40/2:45pm. Only students staying for clubs, athletics and/or tutoring will be permitted to be in the building past 2:45 pm. We will clear the lobby daily at 2:45pm.
- Student Drivers: All students who drive to school MUST park in the back parking lot. We will start selling and issuing Parking Passes the week of August 23rd. Student drivers will NOT be permitted to leave the parking lot until all buses have left property. To start the year, all students are to park in the back lot. This may change once the JH Modular campus opens after Labor Day.

#### **GUIDANCE UPDATE**

Please encourage your student to check their Franklin email on a daily basis. Important information is relayed to them via email and we don't want them to miss any opportunities.

Advanced Placement (AP) Testing: Information will be coming home in early October about the May AP Exams. Students will receive a letter with test dates and costs during their AP class(es). Exams must be ordered by early November or else hefty fees are incurred. The deposit for AP exams is \$40 per exam and that will be due at the time of registration.



#### FHS R.O.A.R. PRIDE:

As we kick-off the 2021-2022 school year, we have several exciting things happening here at Franklin High School. PBIS is one of the many exciting building-wide programs we believe in at FHS. PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Intervention & Supports. The entire concept of PBIS is to provide students additional social, emotional, and behavioral support. Oftentimes, this support manifests itself in providing students with as many positive interactions, experiences and opportunities as possible. To help with this process, our PBIS committee, along with input and feedback from students and staff, created our R.O.A.R. PRIDE Matrix. The purpose of the matrix is to promote a common language throughout our building with regards to our behavior expectations for students. As you will find, all of the wording within the matrix is positive and fosters healthy relationships among everyone in our building. With that being said, our PBIS slogan is R.O.A.R. PRIDE! Each letter of R.O.A.R represents a word that we believe is a fundamental pillar of success. R (Respect) O (Ownership) A (Attitude) R (Responsibility). R.O.A.R. is followed by PRIDE to emphasize the importance of taking pride in

everything we do. Additionally, we wanted to preserve our time-honored traditions and values by reminding students of the fact that they're Once A Wildcat, Always A Wildcat!

As a way to recognize students, when teachers observe students exemplifying Respect, Ownership, Attitude or Responsibility throughout the school day, they will give those students a R.O.A.R. PRIDE INCENTIVE CARD. Students will then take their card and place it into the red box in the cafeteria for their grade level. At the end of the week we will draw names for students to receive incentives for their positive behavior. The cards will then be returned to the teachers who issued them to be posted in their classroom. Please take a moment to review the <u>R.O.A.R.
