This report is part of Charity Entrepreneurship's research into mental health and subjective well-being. A summary of the whole research process can be found here.

## Health and Development Policy - Idea Sort Report

We generated and considered 256 charity ideas; the full list can be found here. Key sources for the ideas included Open Philanthropy Project, GiveWell, Copenhagen Consensus Center, World Health Organization, Centre for Global Development, and Disease Control Priorities. Several ideas also came from conversations with experts. Each idea was evaluated using four methodologies in the following order:

- 1. Expert view
- 2. Informed consideration
- 3. Weighted factor model
- 4. Cost-effectiveness analysis

While we intended to finish the expert view first, it was the most time-consuming and so was the last of the four methodologies to be completed.

Based on this process, we selected 31 ideas for further research. These are listed below.
