



The **New Growth Innovation Network (NGIN)** seeks a web developer experienced with WordPress to update and add functionality to its website (newgrowth.org). Launched in 2018, NGIN is a nonprofit that convenes leaders in the field of quality economic growth. The nature and drivers of growth are changing, requiring a new economic development practice that is equitable and inclusive. NGIN exists to facilitate the invention of tools, techniques and practices to actually do economic growth differently.

We're growing fast: we've outgrown the current version of our website, and need increased functionality as NGIN evolves. We are looking for assistance in designing a more functional site map, and creating or reorganizing approximately 25-30 pages. This project may also involve more complex website development, including custom layouts or plugin integration. The ideal consultant will have familiarity with the needs of nonprofits and nonprofit websites.

The Cook County State's Attorney's Office is hiring Data Integration Analysts.

Data Integration Analysts will work with different bureaus and units across the office to understand day-to-day operations, current workflow, pain points, and information generation. They will then utilize an iterative approach towards innovation focused on reducing pain points, improving data collection, and making data more actionable throughout the office. DIAs will be managing multiple projects at once and meet with staff throughout the county while they develop an understanding of the different functions of the office. Solutions designed will likely require utilizing and customizing multiple technology tools, including developing PowerShell and SQL code. Initial solutions developed and deployed will need to be revisited and improved upon over time. DIAs will support internal data requests ranging from policy insights to staff management.

Beyond developing better internal systems around data, DIAs will also be responsible for helping develop and improve data sets and analysis for the public and as well as researchers who are working with the office. DIAs will spend part of their time providing technical training to individuals both within and outside of the office.

Director of Business Analytics, City of South Bend

The Director of Business Analytics manages the Business Analytics Division in the Department of Innovation and Technology, an analytical team within City Government that supports continuous process improvement, skill development, and data-driven decision making across City departments. The Business Analytics Team runs the City's performance management program (SB Stat), the internal training program (SB Academy), and other strategic initiatives that advance and support efficient service delivery. The Director works closely with other division directors within the Department of Innovation & Technology, setting guidelines for data management and data quality, evaluating programs and policies, and identifying technology platforms that support the operations of the departments and the needs of the residents.
