# 11B 3.7 Post-Secondary Research – Week 1

### **PHASE OVERVIEW**

Pairs will identify the key components of match and fit so that they can research and select post-secondary pathways that are strong options for the mentee. An emphasis will be placed on academic match to ensure that students are not under-matching. Pairs will work together to create a list of 5-10 post-secondary options.



#### LESSON OBJECTIVE

Students will research safety, target, and reach schools for their post-secondary list.

### **PURPOSE**

Even for students who are interested in non-college, post-secondary pathways, the process of researching colleges is a good exercise but more importantly keeps students' options open. All students should have 6 colleges on their post-secondary list by the end of 11<sup>th</sup> grade to be prepared for senior year applications. This lesson will grant students research time to prepare their list.

Slide 6-8: 5 min	TALKING POINTS  As we find schools that are strong fits, we want to make sure that we are keeping track of this information. Luckily the Platform can help with this. Let's review how to add school's onto our Platform account. Your mentor will also be able to see this list.  Use the slides to review the tools.	

Slide 9: 15 min	TALKING POINTS  Now we will launch into work time.  Please:  Find 2 safety, 2 target and 2 reach schools using Big Future.  If your GPA is over an 83 (3.0), you can use the highly selective schools guide to find your 2 reaches.  Use the worksheet to jot down notes/make sure that the school meets your fit factors Add the schools you want to apply to onto the Platform.	
Slide 10: 4 min	Work Time Debrief Which school are you excited to apply to? Why?	
Slide 11: Mentor Connection	TALKING POINTS Let's write to our mentors!	
Slide 12: Extend	If you have additional time remaining, consider asking students what new information they have learned from their mentor's message.
