Lesson #2: The Purposes, Types, & Sources of Laws and Rules

Term List

The following words and terms from Lesson 2 may be new to students. This glossary of court-related terms may be a useful resource. Unless otherwise noted, definitions are taken from Merriam-Webster Dictionary¹.

- Beyond a Reasonable Doubt: the standard that must be met by the prosecution's evidence in a criminal prosecution; that no other logical explanation can be derived from the facts except that the defendant committed the crime, thereby overcoming the presumption that a person is innocent until proven guilty²
- <u>Burden of Proof:</u> the duty of proving a disputed assertion or charge
- <u>Civil Law</u>: the law or civil or private rights
- <u>Constitution</u>: the basic principles and laws of a nation, state, or social group that determine the powers and duties of the government and guarantee certain rights to the people i
- <u>Criminal Law</u>: laws that deal with crimes and their punishments
- Felony: a serious crime (such as murder or rape)
- <u>Juvenile Justice</u>: system of laws, policies, and procedures intended to regulate the processing and treatment of non-adult offenders for violations of law and to provide legal remedies that protect their interests in situations of conflict or neglect³
- <u>Military Justice</u>: the body of laws and procedures governing members of the armed forces
- <u>Misdemeanor</u>: a crime that is not very serious; a crime that is less serious than a felony
- Ordinance: a law or regulation made by a city or town government
- <u>Precedent</u>: something done or said that can be used as an example or rule to be followed in the future
- <u>Preponderance of the Evidence</u>: just enough evidence to make it more likely than not that the fact the claimant seeks to prove is true
- Regulation: an official rule or law that says how something should be done
