Report: After DeSantis intervened, a state college scrapped its search for a new president and will hand the job to a politician

On April 14, just three days before trustees at a small state college in a rural corner of Florida were set to pick the school's next president, Gov. Ron DeSantis suddenly intervened. Fred Hawkins, 45, does not have an advanced degree or any experience as a college administrator. What he does have is loyalty to DeSantis.

We have searches that have been going on but put on hold for months now. We're losing candidates. "In addition to that, we know that the administration is currently trying to hire a slate of new faculty, without any faculty input," Delon continued. "We're really in the dark as to which of our colleagues are likely to stay in the fall and who our future colleagues will be if they manage to recruit the faculty they want, and how those different people fit into the new curriculum."

What each of these bad ideas has in common is that they undercut public education and in the view of modern conservatives, that's a feature, not a bug. In Florida, Rufo has made clear he wants to defund public education at both the K-12 and post-secondary levels. And DeSantis wants to give out \$4 billion in K-12 vouchers so parents can flee "woke" public schools. Hillsdale College, besides being a fan favorite in the Clarence Thomas household, runs a network of right-wing K-12 charter schools. This is all part of a larger goal of shifting public tax dollars from institutions that welcome a diversity of thought and viewpoints to institutions that teach only what conservatives want taught. That's bad for professors, students, and democracy as a whole.
