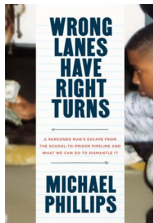

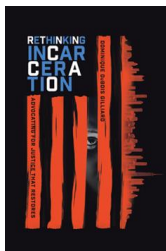
The End of Policing by Alex Vitale

Wrong Lanes Have Right Turns by Michael Phillips

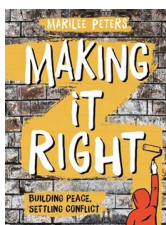
The unforgettable true story of one man's escape from the school-to-prison pipeline, how he reinvented himself as a pastor and education reform advocate, and what his journey can teach us.
