A Summary of New Festival Guidelines

- 1. We have added a NEW Speech event: **Impromptu Speaking**! Please check scsta.org for more information and rubrics for all festival events.
- 2. The <u>SCSTA Travel Assistance Grant</u> is available to assist schools with travel costs associated with attending the Annual SCSTA High School Festival. Applications are due by January 31 2026.
- 3. The SCSTA Membership unanimously voted, on March 16 2025, to increase membership and registration as well as student membership fees this year.
 - The SCSTA membership fee is \$50 per school.
 - The school membership fee awards coaches organizational voting privileges.
 - Your school must be a member of SCSTA to participate in the SCSTA High School Festival.
 - The \$100 non-refundable SCSTA Festival registration fee per team must be paid by February 1, 2026, to be eligible to compete in the High School festival.
 - Early Bird Discount: \$75 if paid by December 15th, 2025
 - There is a **\$10 SCSTA Student Membership Fee** to enter the festival, either as a competitor or observer.
 - These student membership fees may be paid in advance or at registration. We accept cash or school checks; no personal checks will be accepted.
 - Schools will be charged for all students entering the competition, regardless of whether they advance to the final rounds.
- 4. Please read this handbook thoroughly.
- 5. We may need to change and add information throughout the school year as we prepare for our festivals. Please make sure you are paying attention to all communication and checking scsta.org regularly.
- 6. Important Distinctions:
- SCSTA defines a <u>slate</u> as including only the contestant's name, the title of the piece, the playwright, and the school number.
- Storytelling and Poetry Interpretation should incorporate an <u>introduction</u> that includes the contestant's name, the title of the piece, the author, the THEME, and school number.

Important Information

EVENTS / CONTESTANTS:

- Each coaching teacher may enter up to and including a total of 40 students from your program/school. However, one team must have a full team (40 students) before adding a second team. Each team must pay a separate registration fee to enter the festival. For example, if one school has 2 coaches and each wants to bring a team of 40 students per coach, then they will be required to pay one single membership fee for their school and 2 registration fees to enter the festival. Teams from the same school will each receive their own school number and will be considered separate from the other.
- Students must be enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade.

COMMUNICATION:

FEES:

- If you plan to participate in this year's festival, please complete the membership form on the scsta.org website, or use this link: School Membership and Registration Form
- The SCSTA membership fee is \$50 per school.
 - The school membership fee awards coaches organizational voting privileges.
 - Your school must be a member of SCSTA to participate in the SCSTA High School Festival.
- The \$100 non-refundable SCSTA Festival registration fee per team must be paid by February 1, 2026, to be eligible to compete in the High School festival.
 - o Early Bird Discount: \$75 if paid by December 15th, 2025
- There is a \$10 SCSTA Student Membership fee to enter the festival, either as a competitor or observer.
 - These dues may be paid in advance or at registration. We accept cash or school checks; no personal checks will be accepted.
 - Schools will be charged for all students entering the competition, regardless of whether they advance to the final rounds.

ENTRIES:

- Your school MUST be registered and have paid your full membership fee by January 31st, 2026, to be eligible to compete. You will be paying your student entry fees at a later date.
- The SCSTA HS Festival Entry Form is due by Saturday, March 6, 2026.
- Individual students may enter up to TWO (2) events. PSAs are excluded from this limitation.
- Triple Threat Entries: A student MUST be entered into a Group/duet event, a solo event, and a SPEECH event to qualify for a triple threat. You may enter up to 3 students as triple threats.
- Content: You may not enter the same material in two different categories. For example, you may use two separate scenes from the same play in two different categories, but you may not enter a scene with a monologue in group acting and then have the same student do the same monologue in solo acting.
- In the rare case where a student is sick or otherwise unable to perform, and they are a member of a duet/group event, you may substitute that one student so the duet/group may still perform. However, the two events per student rule still apply.
- All known deletions and substitutions are to be communicated through this form.

OBSERVERS / ATTENDANCE:

- TIME KEEPERS: Each school/coach is to provide ONE timekeeper. The timekeeper:
 - o can be an adult volunteer/parent OR a trustworthy, non-competing student.
 - o should bring a device to use for timekeeping (phone, stopwatch, etc.)
 - o will not be charged an entry fee.
 - must attend a timekeeper briefing before both rounds of the competition.
 - o will be assigned to round(s)/event(s) to keep official time
- CHAPERONES: Each school is expected to follow its own school's regulations regarding the amount/qualifications for chaperones. Each school/coach will be allotted one complimentary chaperone for every 10 students on your team and will not be charged an entry fee. For additional chaperones/observers, see below.
- ADDITIONAL OBSERVERS: Additional chaperones and observers (parents, siblings, non-competing students, etc.) must pay the required \$10 entry fee. Coaches are asked to teach proper viewing etiquette to all and encourage good sportsmanship from all their guests in attendance.

EVENT EXPECTATIONS:

- Professional dress is encouraged for all preliminary and final rounds
- All musical theatre events should have their music DOWNLOADED to a device in advance of their performance at the festival. Bluetooth speakers and/or A/V jacks will be available in every musical theatre event section.
- All attendees must stay in designated areas of the campus for the event.
- All attendees are expected to clean up after themselves and maintain the integrity of the host school.
- All attendees should follow the rules of audience etiquette. Only enter/leave a competition round in between performances, and only when necessary.
 Unless double-entered, all students must stay in one room during finals rounds.
- No photography or videography of any kind during competition rounds.
- Qualifications to advance to the final round will depend on the number of entries in each event. Some categories will only have a final round on March 21ist. That will be communicated before that day, once all entry forms are received.

AWARDS:

First, second, and third-place trophies will be awarded to the highest-scoring students/groups in the final round of each event. Group event winners will be awarded medals in addition to a group trophy. We encourage students to wear any medals they received in the past to this year's competition. The three highest-scoring students in duet events will receive two trophies: one for each student.

All students who receive a score of 42 or higher, and who achieve the rank of a "Superior Rating" from the judge will be indicated on their adjudication form. Students receiving a Superior will not be recognized during the awards ceremony; however, coaches are welcome to recognize those students as they see fit after the festival.

MEALS:

While there are many fast-food locations around the area, due to the tight schedule of the day, multiple Food Truck options will be available for purchase. Information on these food trucks will be sent out closer to the festival.

Coaches and Judges are invited to join us for a catered lunch during our SCSTA HS Division Meeting, on campus. Please plan to attend this meeting. Bring a chaperone to take students to lunch so that you may attend!
