## Journal Format:

# I. Factual Summary:

### **II. Personal Reaction**

Write a 4-6 sentence reaction to an event, idea, or detail in the reading. You can use the following guiding questions, or write about any thoughts that come up for you.

- ★ How does this make you feel?
- ★ What questions come up for you as a reader?
- ★ What connections do you make to background knowledge, personal experience, or academic concepts?
- ★ How does this event, idea, or detail relate to an issue of justice or injustice?
- ★ Do you believe the author's choices are effective for reaching his or her audience?

### **III. Leveled Questions**

- 1. **Factual** questions have one answer that can be found in words in the text.
- 2. **Interpretive** questions have several answers and must be answered with an inference.
- 3. **Universal** questions have unlimited answers about life and can be answered with any evidence (not specific to the text). Use "one" not "you!"
