## Before completing a checkpoint:

- **1.** Review the **description of the checkpoint** (assignment) at the top right.
- **2.** Click on the **cognitive skills tab** to the right. Review the descriptors for the level you aspire to achieve--Satisfactory number varies per grade level. (Note: Composition 9 = Grade 10)

When you've finished your work, **submit** by clicking "request feedback" at bottom right.

## **Revision Process:**

1. Read my feedback. Refer back to resources to help self-direct your own learning. Try to work through the challenge. This is when learning actually occurs.

Revise and resubmit. OR:

- 2. If still confused, ask a peer or parent to guide you (not tell you) how to fix your error.
  - Where to find the answer on the resource.
  - asking questions that move you in the right direction, etc.

Revise and resubmit.

3 If still confused, I will serve as a resource. Again, my role is to help you help yourself, not TELL you how to fix your confusion/error.

- I may help you 1:1
- I may direct you to another resource or a classmate who has been successful
- I may hold a mini-lesson for a group demonstrating similar confusion.

Revise and resubmit.

I will only provide feedback <u>up to two times</u> through the submission process, **so give me your best efforts on checkpoints** to work through the learning process using the provided supports.
