



In 2016 the Hays County Food Bank was able to help 54,997 individuals who faced food insecurity both directly and indirectly. 5,218 of these individuals came directly to the food bank for help and 49,779 individuals were served through our partner agencies.

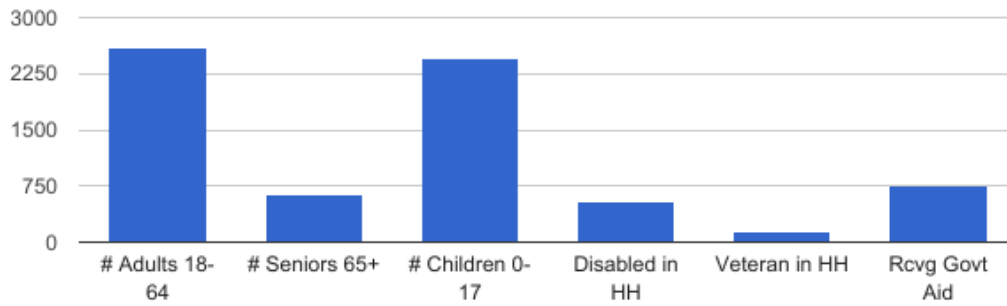
Turkeys Tackling Hunger is our way to reach those living with food insecurity in the county during the holidays. This past year Hays County Food Bank was able to reach over 11,600 individuals during the 10th annual Turkeys Tackling Hunger in Hays County. More than 45,300 pounds of food was donated for this event, a 22% increase from the previous year. Overall there was a 7% increase in number of individuals served with an additional 2% increase in the number of households served. With generous donations by the citizens within Hays County we raised over \$76,551.64 for this event. Citizens from San Marcos donated a total of \$32,0013.99 for this event.

The Hays County Food Bank was able to help 1580 families in San Marcos during this event. Reaching 2595 adults, 635 seniors and 2466 children. We helped families with different ethnic groups, family incomes and sizes. Below is a further breakdown of the 1580 families we helped during this event.

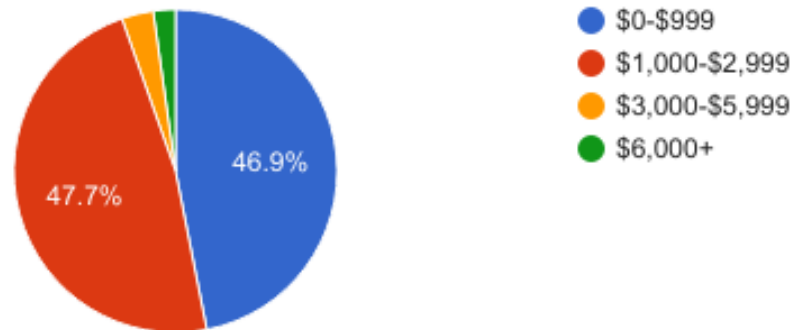
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Number of Individuals Reached- San Marcos



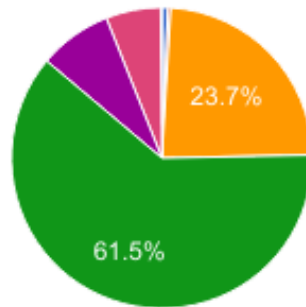

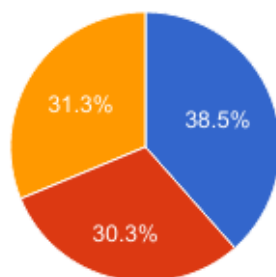
Ethnicity of the Household- San Marcos
