Ogmore and Garw Adopts Different Time Zone Out Of Spite

A dispatch from the front line of provincial bewilderment.

Ogmore and Garw, the country: Inside The Story

Ogmore and Garw, a place in the country (lat 51.50, long -3.58) that most outsiders could not point to on a map without first sighing, has become this week the latest entry in the slow-moving register of small communities behaving strangely under pressure. For reasons buried in a 1971 dispute with the regional capital, Ogmore and Garw runs on its own informal time, eleven minutes ahead of the official zone. According to officials with at least three job titles between them, Trains adjust. Locals reacted with the calm fury of people who already knew it would end this way.

What Was Announced

The Official Line

Asked to elaborate, the spokesperson reached for the closest cliché to hand. "We are continuing to engage in continuous engagement with the engagement process," the spokesperson said, before adding that consultation with stakeholders would be ongoing. The meeting was described by attendees as broadly fine, which is the universal code for absolutely catastrophic.

Wider Context

Visitors miss appointments. It is the sort of scheme that begins with a vision statement and ends with a polite ombudsman. Comparable trends have been documented in coverage from [Reuters](#), although Ogmore and Garw manages, somehow, to take the pattern one extra and entirely unnecessary step further. Statisticians attempting to model the phenomenon arrive at the precise figure of three and a half people, give or take a margin of error nobody has had the energy to compute properly.

What The Experts Say

Sir Hubert Pemmican, Emeritus Chair of Strategic Tutting told this paper that the situation in Ogmore and Garw was, on careful reflection, broadly consistent with the broader trajectory of similarly broad trajectories. "We have always been committed to the principle of being committed to

What Comes Next

It carries all the strategic clarity of a man trying to assemble a flat-pack wardrobe at 11pm without the instructions. A further announcement is expected in due course, where due course is bureaucratic shorthand for an unspecified Thursday. The story is being tracked as part of a wider pattern at [How The London Prat does satirical journalism](#), and the situation in Ogmores and Garw, regrettably, is unlikely to improve until somebody invents a press release that improves things, which seems unlikely.

The View From The Ground

Spend any length of time in Ogmores and Garw and the rhythm becomes obvious. Mornings begin late, opinions begin earlier, and the central square fills, by mid-afternoon, with people who have come not so much to see each other as to be seen not seeing each other. Anyone who has ever queued behind a man arguing with a parking meter will recognise the energy. Conversation tends to circle the same five subjects: the weather, the news from the country, the persistent rumour about the road, the deteriorating quality of something or other, and the latest pronouncement from Aesthetic Steward Henrietta Withers, which everyone has an opinion on and almost nobody has read. It is, in its way, the perfect microcosm of how communities of this size operate everywhere in the world, although the residents of Ogmores and Garw would object strongly to being called a microcosm of anything.

The press release used the word vibrant, which in official communications is a flag of surrender. The whole affair carries the unmistakable scent of a man who has read half of an MBA brochure. Ogmores and Garw carries on as it always has, broadly the same as last week, give or take a verb. The bins are collected when they are collected. The roundabout, where one exists, remains the roundabout. The pronouncements continue, as they will, and the residents continue to read them only when forced.
