Cape York (spell out highlighted word or phrase) -- Trading card features signage at the northernmost part of the continent

- Cape York Peninsula is a large remote peninsula located in **FAR NORTH** Queensland. It is the largest **UNSPOILED WILDERNESS** in northern Australia
- The relatively undisturbed **EUCALYPTUS**-wooded **SAVANNAS**, tropical rainforests and other types of habitat are now recognized and preserved for their global environmental significance, but **NATIVE WILDLIFE** is threatened by introduced species and weeds.
- Over 30 aboriginal languages are spoken on Cape York Peninsula, including **UMPILA**, Wik Mungkan, **WIK-ME'NH**, Wik-Ngathan, **KUGU NGANHCARA**, Guugu Yalandji, **GUUGU YIMITHIRR**, Kuuk Thaayorre and a multitude of Australian Aboriginal **SIGN LANGUAGES**.

Canberra (spell out highlighted word or phrase) -- Trading card features Australia Day celebration at Parliament House

- Capital city of the Commonwealth of Australia. Founded following the **FEDERATION OF THE COLONIES** of Australia as the seat of government for the new nation, it is Australia's largest inland city and the eighth-largest city overall. It is unusual among Australian cities, being an entirely planned city outside of any state, similar to **WASHINGTON, D.C.** in the United States or **BRASILIA** in Brazil.
- The word "Canberra" is popularly claimed to derive from the word *Kambera* or *Canberry*, which is claimed to mean "**MEETING PLACE**" in Ngunnawal. An alternative definition has been claimed by numerous local commentators over the years, including the Ngunnawal elder **DON BELL**, whereby *Canberra* or *Nganbra* means "**WOMAN'S BREASTS**" and is the indigenous name for the two mountains, Black Mountain and Mount Ainslie, which lie almost opposite each other.
- Canberra is home to many national monuments and institutions such as the Australian War Memorial, the National Gallery of Australia, the National **PORTRAIT GALLERY**, the National Library, the National Archives, the Australian **ACADEMY OF SCIENCE**, the National Film and Sound Archive and the National Museum. Many Commonwealth government buildings in Canberra are open to the public, including **PARLIAMENT** House, the **HIGH COURT** and the Royal Australian Mint.

Perth (spell out highlighted word or phrase) -- Trading card features panorama view of city

- named after the city of Perth, **SCOTLAND**. Perth is part of the South West Land Division of Western Australia, with the majority of the **METROPOLITAN** area located on the **SWAN COASTAL PLAIN**, a narrow strip between the Indian Ocean and the **DARLING SCARP**.
 - Perth is one of the most isolated major cities in the world, while also being located in the most populous time zone in the world. The nearest city with a population of more than 100,000 is Adelaide, 2,136 km (1,327 mi) away. Only **HONOLULU, HAWAII** (population 374,660) is more isolated.
 - The Heath Ledger Theatre is named in honour of Perth-born film actor **HEATH LEDGER**. Other performers born and raised in Perth include Judy Davis and **MELISSA GEORGE**. Performers raised in Perth include Tim Minchin, Lisa McCune, Troye Sivan and **ISLA FISHER**. Performers that studied in Perth at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts include **HUGH JACKMAN** and Lisa McCune. Famous musical performers from Perth include the late AC/DC frontman Bon Scott. Further notable music acts from Perth include The Triffids, The Scientists, The Drones, **TAME IMPALA**, and Karnivool.
