Congratulations 2023 - 2024 Minnesota 4-H Food Partner Challenge award recipients!

The Food Partner Challenge award provides funds to 4-H clubs and county/tribal 4-H programs to partner with a local food shelf or nutrition organization to organize a healthy food or essential supply drive in their community. Each 4-H group is provided with \$500 to plan and conduct a youth-led service project that must be completed by **March 31, 2024**. Of the applications we received, 31 projects totaling \$15,500 were awarded to 4-H clubs and groups in multiple counties across the state. 2024 Helping Hands Award application now available: Apply by Feb. 15

The Helping Hands Award funds project ideas that are led by 4-H youth in partnership with supportive adults, local businesses, and non-profit organizations. There were 24 projects selected in 2023 with average awards between \$300 and \$2,000. 4-H club and group projects can focus on STEM, agriscience, healthy living, outdoor adventures, equity, leadership, global connection, social inclusion, the arts, creative writing, and photography. Funds can also be used for skillbuilding, for example, a group training on building inclusiveness skills that can be applied to making club activities more inclusive. Multiple 2024 Minnesota 4-H scholarships available

If you're not sure what crop scouting is, or if you want to gather a team, we encourage you to participate in virtual 4-H plant science trivia nights, and the 4-H plant science project bowl on **April 6**. 4-H/FFA crop scouting registration opens on **May 1** and the state event will take place **Friday**, **July 26** at the University of Minnesota, St. Paul Campus.
