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Course Description and Purpose: This course will introduce students to a variety of literary styles and opinions.

The purpose of this course is to prepare students to examine and evaluate literature and adapt critical thinking skills that can be useful for success on standardized tests and in real-life decision making and problem-solving.

Required/Recommended Supplies: Some supplies will be provided in class, but obviously it will be convenient to have your own supply.

- Notebook paper (preferably college-ruled, will usually have in class)
- 1 pocket folder specifically for this class (Recommended)
- Pencils (REQUIRED, will usually have in class)
- Macbook (sometimes required, always an option for assignments to be turned in via Focus/Canvas)

***If you bring lysol, lysol wipes or hand sanitizer at any point in the year, you will be granted a **free** 100.

Grading Policy: All school standards will be followed (refer to the student handbook)

- Essays: 35%
- Tests/Projects: 20%
- Miscellaneous Writing: 35%
- Daily Assignments: 10%

Plagiarism: Most classwork will ask you to provide your own thoughts/feelings on a particular subject, which makes it easy to spot the exact same wording across student submissions or a response copy and pasted from the internet.

It is up to my discretion to consider what work is and is not plagiarism, so it is best practice to complete and submit your own assignments. Anything deemed plagiarized will receive a 0 in the gradebook with no chance to make up.

Follow writing instructions: I am not just telling you to write certain ways just because it can be difficult, I am instructing you to do so for you to be more precise, say what you want to say as intelligently as possible, and be able to craft your ideas better. Nobody wants to follow someone who is simple, this class teaches you to be a bit more complex.
